WEATHER - Global temperatures will continue to rise over the next 12 months as rising levels of greenhouse gas emissions and El Niño combine to bring more record-breaking warmth to the planet.

The 2019 prediction for this upcoming winter. For the quickest breakdown, the U.S. Snowfall will be above normal in the north and below normal in the south, with the snowiest periods in late November, late December, early and late January, mid- to late February, and early March. IN CHINA - DEBT BUBBLE BURSTS - China begins a downward spiral and people take to the streets.

New Tax Law Impacts Home Sales Activity - More Than You Might Think. The impact the current tax bill might have on lending and home prices when it becomes law, likely won't affect lending, but it will affect prices. We are looking at up to a 10% drop in most U.S. markets for properties going for more than \$500,000, and up to a 15% drop in high-value markets like New York, San Francisco, and Seattle. "Taking away the mortgage interest deduction, which is a major incentive for buying a home, would no longer be part of the tax code".

The Federal Debt Will Increase - The U.S. debt has remained stable after sequestration kicked in, which required a mandatory 10 percent federal budget cut through 2021. But that could be repealed under a Trump presidency. **How It Affects You** - Social Security pays for itself, and Medicare partially does, at least for now.

As Washington wrestles with the best way to go about addressing the debt, uncertainty arises over tax rates, benefits, and federal programs. Businesses react to this uncertainty by hoarding cash, hiring temporary instead of full-time workers, and delaying major investments.

Federal spending is a component of GDP, which measures the output of the entire economy. Elected officials use discretionary fiscal policy to manage the economy. Higher income taxes take money out of consumers' pockets, regardless of where the tax is imposed. Business taxes are passed on through higher prices, or through layoffs and reduced investment for companies that can't raise prices.

Supply-side economics theorizes that lowering business taxes frees up funds to hire more workers. But it doesn't work when the maximum tax rate is below 50 percent, according to the Laffer Curve. Whether it's done through tax hikes, spending cuts, or both, austerity measures mean slower economic growth.

INVENTIONS and TECHNOLOGY - Financial Trend - A Radical Change in Banking Models. Traditional banking models are fading away. The desire for people to bank whenever they want and wherever they wish makes digital banking top priority. This development makes your phone to become your wallet.

Speed is paramount in Modern Banking. Users of bank services will want to access online services faster, whether it is statement processing, banking services or lending. Elimination of intermediaries is an idea worth consideration to serve customers better.

Technology and the Sharing Economy - There has been the rise of sharing economy and digitization. Some major industrial giants like Amazon, Uber, and Google experienced disruption as a result of shared-economy. Shared-economy is a non-dying trend and is expected to grow

to \$335 billion by 2025. Today, customers have gladly accepted this collaborative model. The recent success and growth of shared-business solutions demonstrate that shared-economy will ring true beyond 2018. Millennials are the key to success and the driving force behind this new economy.

The Modern Workplace Evolution - The workplace is going to get better with businesses changing the way they use space to drive productivity. We will continue to see an increase of providers and health system mergers. By the end 2019, 93% or more of metropolitan areas will be highly concentrated in terms of hospitals. When providers merge, they increase their negotiating power. They say that megamergers will reduce costs long term through efficiencies of an integrated system, but for 2019, this integration will most likely provide price increases. Secondly, due to increased negotiation power, megamergers put pressure on total costs which causes the insurance carriers to increase reimbursement levels. MORE MONEY for 2019 for us for sure.

As in a megamerger, the same effect occurs when physicians consolidate with other physicians' groups, hospitals and health systems. Physician consolidation may have more efficiencies and lower prices in the future, but we have yet to see any prices for medical care decrease because of it. NO DECREASE IN 2019

Stem cell treatments (by 2026) - From blindness to cancer to lung disease to heart failure, stem cells are being applied in hundreds of clinical trials across the world. Last year, the FDA hit a big milestone when it approved HEMACORD, the first umbilical cord product for use in stem cell transplants.

Some more interesting predictions. Smart drugs that improve mental functions by 2019. We will find a way to stabilize progression of Dementia / Alzheimer, very soon, and then a vaccine all in the next 5 to 10 years. I don't know about a cure, but this is promising progress.

Gene therapy by 2030. Hybrid-assisted limbs that are embedded in the wearer's body by 2032

Robots make surgery zipper scars a thing of the past - Beings like Carnegie Mellon snake bot can poke through your abdomen, and cut, clamp or cauterize organs, making recovery from things like heart surgery a matter of a few days, with nothing but a tiny pockmark to show for it.

Medication tailored to a person's individual genome - Since the sequencing of the human genome in the summer of 2000, hopes have been way up to bring to market medication that's custom-designed for your unique genetics. Computer technology and growing familiarity with genomics has made this reality before 2019 but so much more ahead in this field.

Blasting brain tumors with particle accelerator light - Imagine a device the size of a small sports stadium, focused on zapping cancer out of you. Sounds like a new way to die, but such devices – called synchrotrons – are already capable of focusing and dialing-down their intense light (like Cyclops from X-Men) to do good, in this case, pinpointing and eradicating tumors.

All-electronic medical records, everywhere

Decades in the making, this is technically possible now and just about to reach critical mass in the developed world.

Electronic, networked test results

Made instantly possible by worldwide digital medical records, test results beamed from the lab to a doctor or nurses PDA would save lives by bridging the gap between observation and treatment. Happening now.

Robots making up half to 75% of the nursing workforce

Robots are already being deployed on a test basis as caregivers in hospitals across the globe. More advanced versions replace human tech or nursing staff in situations where the job is especially dull, dirty or dangerous.

Pre-programmed ailments and complex situations in robots to train medical staff

These already exist in test phases at universities. Such "smart dummies" could replace cadavers in med school and let interns make fewer mistakes on real people early in their careers.

Self-serve diagnosis - Much like self-serve check-outs in big-box stores, such computer kiosks could let people deliver detailed information beyond the waiting room clipboard that doctors can use to get a quicker sense of what's bothering a patient, leading to shorter visits and speedier treatment.

Systems biology saves the day - This science that combines empirical, mathematical and computational techniques to understand complex problems of biology will likely be a household term in the medical community soon, paving the way for medical breakthroughs we can scarcely imagine now.

Telesurgery comes-of-age - It's not science fiction to hear about an operation done with surgeons in one city and the patient in another but it isn't yet commonplace and without added risk. Watch for now and in the next decade for the world's top surgeons to work their magic across the world from the comfort of their own hospital.

Artificial intelligence for diagnosis - People who complain about their doctor's bedside manner will probably make up much of the early adopters of computer-built medical minds to mend their troubles. We already have WATSON the diagnosing computer, but his chores will expand far past diagnosing conditions.

Whether you call it organ printing, bio-printing, bio-manufacturing or computer-aided tissue engineering, it sounds a lot easier than it is.
