

JESUS HAD SOMETHING OTHERS NEEDED

And the whole multitude sought to touch him: for there went virtue out of him, and healed them all. (Luke 6:19)

You were created to change somebody. People desire excellent. They may want financial freedom, or their health to improve. Maybe they are lonely. You may not be sent to everyone, but you are definitely sent to someone.

You will not be qualified to help every person you meet. You will be able to help someone with what you possess. Jesus knew this and understood this principle.

There are four types of people in your life: those who add, subtract, divide, or multiply. Every relationship will affect you. Those relationships that do not increase you will inevitably decrease you.

He that walketh with wise men shall be come wise: but a companion of fools shall be destroyed. (Proverbs 13:20)

Each relationship you have will either nurture strength or a weakness within you.

Many people want to change! They just don't know how to change. Alcoholics hates the bondage they are in, smokers long to quit, drug addicts want to break their addictions.

Jesus walked among the people, he listened to the people, and he talked to the people about their problems. He showed them a new way. Jesus was a roadmap to the lost and a companion to the lonely.

Use your gifts that God has given you to bless others. Remember Joseph had the gift to interpret dreams. You must know your gifts and make them available. Not everybody will need them, but somebody will need them.

JESUS EDUCATED THOSE HE MENTORED

**You will always remember what you teach. **

It is very important that you mentor someone. Teach them what you know; especially the ones you have authority over or any person who has to carry out an instruction for you. (i.e., employees, children and etc.)

Successful business people have employees who are informed, well trained and confident about carrying out their instructions. This takes time. It takes energy, and it takes great patience.

Remember every song needs a singer, every achiever needs motivation, and every student needs a teacher.

Jesus was a master teacher.

1. He taught about prayer (Matthew 26:36-46)
2. He taught about heaven (John 14:2-4)
3. He educated his staff (the 12 disciples) on topics including His purpose, giving, relationship
4. He taught in synagogues (Luke 13:10)
5. He taught in villages (Mark 6:6)

Here is the point I am making; *none of us were born with great knowledge*. You became what you are. You discovered what you know. It took time, energy and learning.

Your staff will not know everything. They may not see what you see. You must invest time to nurture their vision and their product knowledge.

Jesus educated his staff. He constantly motivated the people he led by showing them the future of their present commitment.

Take time to train others. Jesus did.
