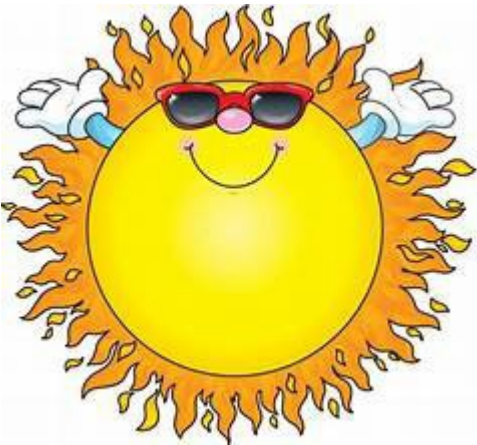

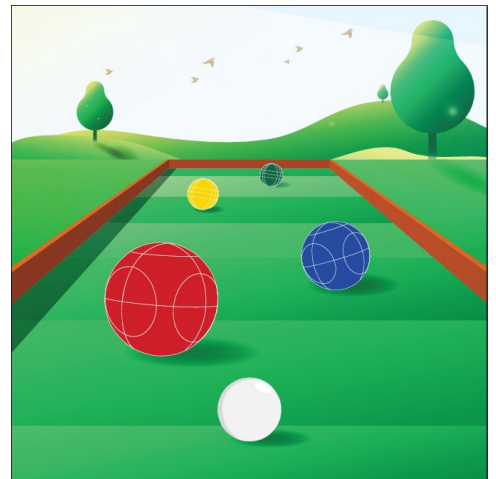

Mary Ellen Maciag

On Thursday March 28, Mary Ellen Maciag passed away peacefully with family by her side. She was 88 years old.

Raised in Westchester County, New York, family and faith were at the center of Mary Ellen's life. She met George, her husband of 63 years, at a dance at St. Vincent's nursing school when a nun said to her, "go over and talk to those boys. You can't tell, but you might meet the man that you are going to marry." She was predeceased by her husband George and is survived by her four children and their spouses: Frank, Julie (Carlo), Mike (Elizabeth) and Chris, and seven grandchildren.



Mary Ellen earned her nursing degree from Saint Vincent's and later a Master's in Nursing from San Jose State. Through her career, she practiced nearly every type of nursing from intensive care and surgery to creating new models for occupational health at Hewlett Packard. Mary Ellen was a lifelong learner. She continuously furthered her education and loved sharing her knowledge with others through teaching, training, and writing. She was a published author in medical journals including an award-winning piece on occupational health nursing. Mary Ellen often said that if she could teach full time, she would do it for free.

Mary Ellen was skilled in painting, flower arranging, and a wide variety of home projects. From a simple flower in a tiny vase, to Ikebana arrangements she learned in Japan, her arrangements and art adorned her home and decorated the many events that she hosted with George. She sewed hand-made down jackets, reupholstered a classic car, and created the finest "Tin Man" costume the third grade has ever seen.

Faith permeated every part of Mary Ellen's life which she lived with grace. She was an active member of Saint Nicholas church from the time that she and her family moved to California in 1974. Even with late-in-life dementia, she retained her sense of humor, wisdom, and gratitude. She would often express how she felt "blessed."
