Reaching Out KGLP's Ops Report

New Equipment and Technical Updates - After 7 years of preparation, KGLP's new STL (Studio Transmitter Link) system is in Beta test (not active, while we work out the bugs.) A big addition by this Winter will be a power backup system capable of keeping our 91.7 FM signal on the air for several hours, whenever Continental Divide electricity is interrupted. The new STL will eventually convey audio from our UNM-Gallup studio up to Gibson Peak's 91.7 FM transmitter, at

which point our old Moseley STL system can be removed and sent off for repair (then returning as a backup STL.) We are hoping that this new system will reduce the amount of clicks heard on our broadcast, though weather has continued to cause static and "scratchy" clicks or other disruptions to our broadcast.

Repeater Stations - KGLP is working on a repeater station that, by Fall 2025, will carry our signal out to Ramah, New Mexico, and a bit further East, perhaps reaching past El Morro National Monument.

Gallup Public Radio meets In-Person, on the second Monday of each month, starting at 5:30pm, Mountain. As always, the public is welcome to attend.





KGLP Ops Report

Repeater Stations (continued from Page 1)

We are still awaiting word from the FCC on our application for a potential repeater on the Summit West of the Window Rock, Arizona.

This is a lengthy process. It requires a lot of paperwork, strategizing and engineering. We appreciate your patience as we continue to work on these projects.

Website update - KGLP.org has a few humble updates, including an interactive Program Guide, which you can access by selecting “Listen to KGLP”, and then scrolling down to a “button” – you can then select any program on the schedule to get more information on that show, whether syndicated, network, or local. We’ve added links to our “Staff and Volunteer” listings, and our “PSA’s and Events” page has links for the National Weather Service forecast, plus a “Fire and Smoke” map of The U.S. and parts of Canada, Mexico, Alaska, and Hawaii.

Staffing update - In January, Ops Manager Emma Farley left the station for a new job. In late June, KGLP hired Jonathan Decker, host of “Island Time”, which airs at 9am,

Mountain, on Fridays, as our Assistant Station Manager. By Winter, we expect to hire a part-time Production Assistant, and by January, perhaps we’ll have a GMCS high school Senior serving as an intern. Our goal with such personnel is a full back stop of the Station Manager’s duties, for contingency, and for the long-term health of KGLP.

Programming Changes -

UnderCurrents ended 2 months ago, then replaced with “World Café”. Planetary Radio ended in August, now replaced with Big Picture Science, repeating @ 6am Saturday.

Starting in October, KGLP plans a trial of “Mountain Stage” Saturdays, 4-6pm, Mountain (ironically enough), with a repeat Tuesdays at 9pm.

We welcome public feedback and suggestions on any KGLP programming.

Financial update - In both FY2020 and FY2021, Gallup Public Radio received pandemic-related CARES and ARP grants, which pushed our Total Revenue over the \$300,000 threshold for those years, which automatically triggers the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) to require that an Audited Financial Statement be included with our annual financial report to the granting agency. Fortunately, the CPB gave us a waiver in both years, excusing us from the need for an Audit, a savings of thousands of dollars in CPA fees.

In FY 2022, when we did not have any additional grants, pandemic related or otherwise, Gallup Public Radio's Total Revenue, including donations, grants, underwriting, and in-kind contributions such as our studio space at UNM-Gallup, totaled \$321,333, which exceeded the CPB's annual income threshold again, triggering a requirement for what I believe was our first Audited Financial Statement, uploaded late, but accepted immediately, and soon after, followed by CPB's final grant payment to KGLP for FY 2023, received last month. This is good news, and while we anticipate that

our total revenue for FY2023, which ends this month, will again exceed \$300,000, we have already planned on our next Audit, so that everything will be filed in a timely manner. Thank you to everyone who has helped KGLP reach this milestone! Our financial situation is solid, allowing us to pursue a repeater in the Southeast, and maybe even a repeater West of Window Rock, as well as other projects such as the Gibson Peak power backup and eventually a studio renovation.

Silent Campaign Underway til '24

Many NPR and community radio stations have intense fundraising campaigns known as "pledge drives." Different personalities speak on-air, for 15 minutes or more, telling the audience about the benefits of their station and why they should donate.

For nearly a decade, KGLP has followed a different model - one that is more low-key and slow-burning. We call this a "silent campaign." We schedule occasional 30 second or 60 second donation requests and fundraising updates on-air. We may also request donations through social media. We have found that a "silent campaign" model is most effective for fundraising at KGLP. [\(Continues on Page 9\)](#)

We broadcast to a very unique listening area, where not all of our listeners are able to donate. Therefore, the “silent campaign” model removes that pressure, and allows for those who are able to donate to fill in the gaps for those who cannot. When you give, you help continue needed broadcast services to those who cannot.

KGLP still has bumper stickers, pens, and fridge magnets, plus a few coffee mugs and tote bags. (Pictured in this newsletter.) Anyone who donates, or has donated, \$30 or more, over the last year, is eligible to receive stickers, pens, and magnets. A donation of \$60 or more within the last year qualifies you for pickup of a coffee mug or tote bag, while they last. KGLP's Sustaining Members (those who automatically donate monthly), are eligible for any of the above items. If you're not already a monthly contributor, you can become one of our Sustaining Members by setting up monthly donations today.
