

Producers ended distribution through NPR this year. However, fans can still listen to *Car Talk* podcasts on NPR.org!

We decided to replace the 11 a.m. Saturday hour with *Wait... Wait... Don't Tell Me!* because we felt that it has a similar tone - light-hearted, humorous and entertaining, while also informative.

There are some changes in locally-hosted programs: DJ Marvelous has renamed his mid-day Wednesday *Blues Nation* show as *Soul Power*, to better reflect the diversity of genres featured. Starting on December 6, Strider's *Deer Tracks* show will go to 2 hours, from 12 to 2 p.m., Mountain Time, with *Oyate Ta Olowan: Songs of the People*, featuring cultures from the Americas and Alaska, airing at 2 p.m. through May 2022.

We also have a new Native music program on KGLP – *Gaënö*, a one hour, weekly show from Native Voice One. Host Brett Maybee plays music from a variety of


across the modern Native American music scene. *Gaënö* has two spots on KGLP's program schedule - Tuesdays at 9 p.m. (replacing *Undercurrents*) and Fridays at 1 p.m. (replacing the *Toasted Sister Podcast and Peace Talks*, the latter still airing at 11 p.m. Sunday nights).

The *Toasted Sister Podcast*, a show about Native American Food, has not been produced since April 2021. While we had previously broadcast reruns of *Toasted Sister*, we decided to replace the spot with *Gaënö*, so that we could air fresher content.


We believe that *Gaënö* is a good replacement for Toasted Sister, as they are both shows that have a unique gaze. We will periodically broadcast new episodes of the *Toasted Sister Podcast*, if they become available. Friday's 1 p.m. *Gaënö* hour is occasionally pre-empted for local public affairs specials or extended-length episodes of *Friday Forum*.

This summer, we had a temporary program change for 7 weeks. On Saturday evenings at 4 p.m., from August 14th until September 25th, we broadcast audio (continued on page 6)

from the Levitt AMP Concert Series in Gallup. Recorded at the El Morro Theatre in Downtown Gallup, we heard from a variety of artists, spanning genres from country to reggae, and spanning regions from the Pueblo of Laguna to Denver, CO.

Gallup was lucky to be selected as one of twenty communities in the United States to receive this grant from the Mortimer & Mimi Levitt Foundation to host a concert series in an under-utilized public space. KGLP became a local partner for the series. KGLP's Emma Farley was also the videographer for these concerts, broadcasting a live video stream each week to the Gallup Mainstreet Facebook and YouTube pages, and recording audio for air two days later on KGLP.

And finally, our smallest (and smartest?) addition to the program schedule is *Travellers in the Night*. Coming in at 2 minutes every Saturday at 11:58 a.m., these weekly short episodes give us an engaging and informative glimpse into asteroids, comets, spacecraft, and other objects in space.

More In-Person Opportunities In-person activities and events are slowly returning to Gallup. This Fall 2021 semester, UNM Gallup has reopened for in-person classes. For over a year, KGLP staff and volunteers have been some of the only people on campus. It is refreshing to hear more voices in the hall, and see more faces here around KGLP, where we air weekly updates from UNMG's CEO, Dr. James Malm.

We have not yet returned to a permanent in-person board meeting schedule. For now, our meetings will continue via ZOOM. Our board members are most comfortable with that option. As always, the public is welcome to attend these ZOOM meetings – just email manager@kglp.org for details. We hope to eventually return to in-person board meetings on campus.

KGLP has been covering more in-person events for broadcast, as well. This year, KGLP staff have attended the Hozho Academy Reopening, the Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for the Coal Avenue Commons, the Red Rock String Quartet Concert at the First United Methodist Church, the Levitt Amp Concert Series at the El Morro Theatre, the Community Forum on Crime, and the Health Workers Town Hall. Rachel and Emma collected audio from each of these events for broadcast on KGLP. We are very excited to have more local voices, perspectives and music on-air.

While we are excited to get back out there and be more involved with the community, we are also aware that we must continue to take precautions against COVID-19. All KGLP staff and volunteers are fully vaccinated, and Rachel has already received her third booster shot of the Pfizer vaccine. We continue to wear masks when in close proximity to one another. We continue to conduct many of our interviews online, via ZOOM, rather than in-person in our studios. (Continued on Page 8)

Expansion in KGLP's Future?

An exciting new venture may be in KGLP's future... We are exploring options for expanding KGLP's coverage range. If our efforts are successful, in a few years, Gallup Public Radio might reach from Pie Town, NM to Canyon de Chelly, AZ.

COVID-19 Coverage

Reporting on COVID-19 continues to be one of our top priorities at the station. As always, we continue to broadcast updates and events from the New Mexico Department of Health, Indian Health Service, Gallup Indian Medical Center and the Rehoboth McKinley Christian Hospital. We realize that some listeners may find these repeated updates tiring, but bear with us as we strive to support public health in area communities.

This season, we have also focused on pandemic recovery and reflection. Emma Farley interviewed Ricky Serna, Acting Secretary for the Department of Workforce Solutions. They discussed employment opportunities and development in New Mexico. Bernie Dotson also interviewed Gallup Mayor Louie Bonaguidi and Bill Lee, CEO of the Gallup McKinley County Chamber of Commerce. They reflected on Gallup's history with the pandemic, and discussed what the future might hold for Gallup's economy.

Silent Campaign Model continues

Many NPR and community radio stations have intense fundraising campaigns known as "pledge drives." Different personalities speak on-air, for 15 minutes or more, telling the audience about the benefits of their station and why they should donate.

For 8 years, KGLP has decided to go with a different model - one that is more low-key and slow-burning. We call this a "silent campaign." We schedule occasional, 60-second donation requests on-air. We may also request donations through social media. This lasts for several months.

We have found that a "silent campaign" model is most effective for fundraising at KGLP. We broadcast to a very unique listening area, where not all of our listeners are able to donate. Further, the pandemic has worsened conditions for many in our community. We feel that it may be inappropriate to constantly ask for money from those who are unable to donate. Therefore, the "silent campaign" model removes that pressure, and allows for those who are able to donate to fill in the gaps for those who cannot. When you give, you help continue needed broadcast services to those who cannot.

Our Spring/Summer campaign has brought in \$22,000. We are so grateful for each and every person who donated what they could. Our Fall/Winter campaign should last from October 2021 until February 2022, with a goal of \$20,000.


