Specials and Pending KGLP Programming Changes

The Newport Jazz Festival airs Saturday, August 1st, from 3 until 6pm. Shakespeare's Richard II airs over two Saturdays, 4-6pm, August 8 and August 15. Permanent shows:

“Live From Here”, the “A Prairie Home Companion” successor that airs from 4 until 6pm Saturdays, has succumbed to diminishing sponsors and lack of ticket sales due to the pandemic, and leaves KGLP in September.

Another show leaving in September is NPR's “Only a Game”, a sports news magazine that airs at 8am on Saturdays, for which we are looking at several options, which we'd love your feedback on: Start “Weekend Edition Saturday at 8am, going until 11am. Other options include such fare as KUNM's “The Children's Hour”, discussion, games, and explorations with kids; moving existing KGLP shows from earlier or later hours to the 8am slot, such as “Big Picture Science”, “Planetary Radio”, and “Peace Talks Radio”, for example, or adding some other 1-hour long program.

In order to replace the hole left by “Live From Here”, we are looking at a combination of two 1-hour episodes of such music programs as NPR's “World Cafe”, “Mountain Stage”, moving or repeating existing KGLP shows such as “Art of the Song”, eTown, “Wait, Wait, Don't Tell Me”, or adding new spoken word programs. Current thinking: Schedule a music program as a “core” anchor, such as “World Cafe”, with periodic specials such as radio drama from L.A. Theatre Works and other content or specials. Again, we would love to hear what you think!

The successful candidate will learn all KGLP operations. Sound judgment, management and technical skills are needed; excellent oral and written communication skills in English.

Interpersonal communication skills (responding to the public); analytical skills and the ability to learn new material quickly; and general knowledge of media operations. Periodically repair, maintain, and/or replace electronic or mechanical systems, such as computer or radio equipment, circuit boards, electrical wiring, audio cables, etc. Familiarity with computer hardware and software, knowledge of at least one computer programming language or HTML, proven math skills, and/or other experience demonstrating the applicant's ability to understand technology and comprehend reference manuals. Music, theatre, or public speaking performance experience desired. Bilingual capability a plus (Navajo or Spanish preferred), Grant Writing, Sales, and/or Marketing experience helpful. Verifiable past accomplishments (in school, jobs, et. al.) encouraged. Minimum Associates Degree, with Bachelors preferred. 1-2 years minimum experience, whether as a student, volunteer, or worker, demonstrating many of skills listed.

On page 5, you'll find a discussion of the coming end of "Live From Here", which succeeded "A Prairie Home Companion" from 4 until 6pm Saturdays, and "Only a Game", NPR's sports news magazine, airing at 8am Saturdays, both of which will be ending in September. We welcome your feedback, suggestions, and complaints! Just email me: manager@kglp.org.

We are now accepting applications, through August 1, 2020, for a new job position, the Production / Engineering Assistant (Prod / Eng Asst.), or, if you wish, a defacto assistant station manager, backing up the Station Manager and ultimately may be eligible to apply to be the next Station Manager, at which point they will need to train a new Prod / Eng Asst. This goal of a sustainable, full-time (30 hours per week, minimum, initially) second operations employee has been in the works for a decade, and we hope that it will better ensure the ongoing services that KGLP provides to our listeners. The job announcement may be seen at KGLP.org, where you'll also find links for online audio streaming, podcasts, our program guide, donations, board affairs, and social media, including Instagram.

For the latter, KGLP's Instagram page, we need many more photos from you and yours – you may email manager@kglp.org with any images, including descriptions, whether recent or several years old, that relate to happenings or shoutouts for Gallup, the Navajo Nation, and the surrounding area, events, people, KGLP interest, news, or anything else of interest, as we build up that site.

In order to sustain KGLP's broadcast quality, we plan to replace our aging Studio-Transmitter-Link (STL), the Moseley system

that conveys our programming via line-of-site microwave radio, from studios at the University of New Mexico Gallup branch campus up to our new transmitter on Gibson Peak. This will be an IP-based wireless system. The cost for purchase and installation is now projected in the range of around \$25,000 to \$30,000. We have applied for an FCC license for a protected frequency that no other entity can "step on" or interfere with in the future. The next step is to finally get permissions from Vertical Bridge, who owns the Gibson Peak tower that KGLP's antennas reside on, to allow us to install a new microwave antenna. At that point, we will proceed with purchase and installation of the new STL system.

Now, as for fundraising, we're again asking for you to consider supporting the service that Gallup Public Radio provides to the area through KGLP broadcasts.

In early August, we'll begin a low-key / silent Summer/Fall Campaign that will continue through December 31st, hoping again for more of you to become sustaining members who might sign up online for monthly donations through credit, PayPal, or bank transfer, to serve our listeners, the community of Gallup and surrounding areas such as Bread Springs, Churchrock, Tohatchi, Houck, Thoreau, and parts of other communities such as Window Rock, Ft. Defiance, St. Michaels, Ramah, and Zuni.

We also hope that some of our current sustaining members will consider increasing their monthly donation, in recognition of many KGLP listeners who are now unable to contribute in that way.

Cash flow has always been important, as provided by our donors and members. Additionally, our funding from the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (Continued on Page 7)
