### Onward & Outward KGLP's Ops Report

After 6 years of prep, KGLP is now installing our STL (a new Studio Transmitter Link.) This system will help convey audio from our UNM-Gallup studio up to Gibson Peak. We have already installed most of the infrastructure on the roof of Gurley Hall, and are now in the process of accessing the tower on Gibson Peak.

We still have several FCC applications in play, for repeater stations in the Window Rock, Ganado, and Zuni/Ramah areas, and have already applied to two tower owners for rental space. This is a lengthy process. It requires a lot of applications, filings, paperwork, strategizing,

and engineering. The timeline to get these repeater stations on-air could potentially be a few years, and so we appreciate your patience. Perhaps by late 2023, KGLP will be even more accessible to our listeners.

Among new gear, KGLP now has a self-syncing studio clock, new CD players, and a portable public address system (PA). This system includes two large speakers and an audio mixer, and works well with the wireless microphones that KGLP already owns, as well as Bluetooth. With this combined equipment, KGLP will be better prepared to host live community events with great audio. We've also updated online streaming, and now have a better listen line, at 1-833-KGLP-NOW – that's actually: 833-545-7669.

With Dr. James Malm's leave beginning after the May 2022 graduation, Dr. Sabrina Ezzell became the acting Chancellor of UNM-Gallup, and, per Gallup Public Radio's (GPR) by-laws, an ex-officio board member of the GPR board. 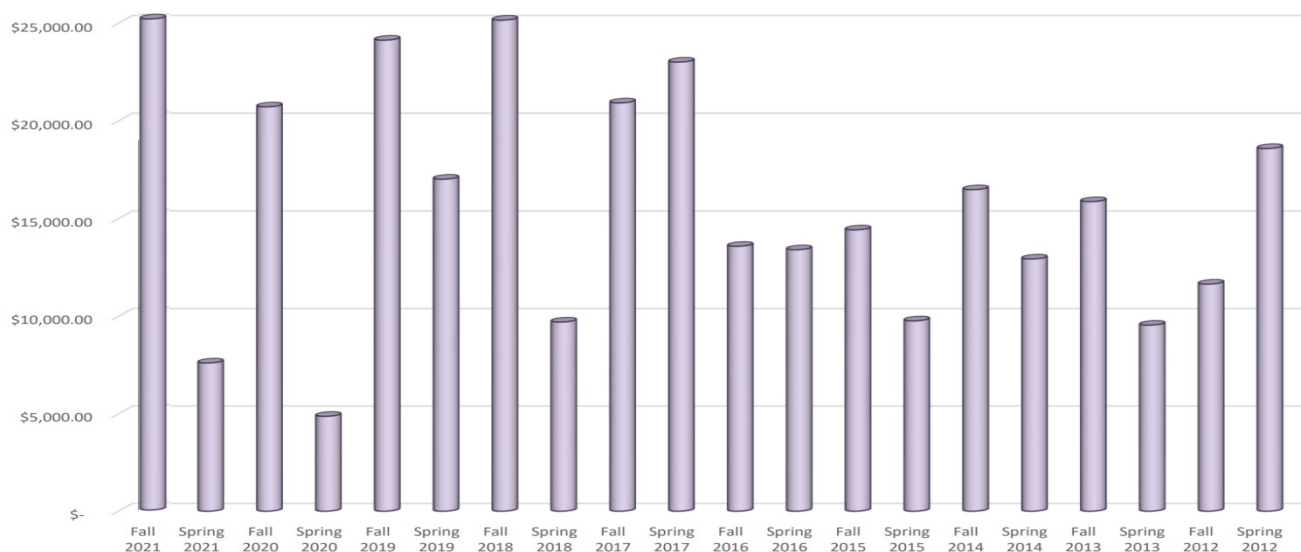

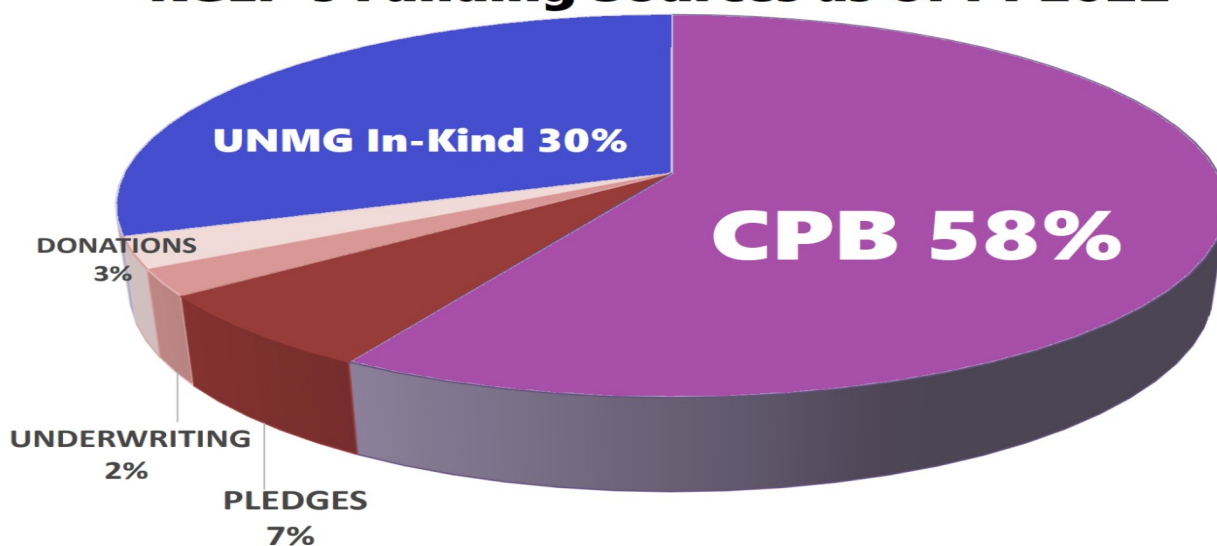

### **KGLP Ops Report** (continued from Page 1)

**Programming Changes:** If you have tuned in to KGLP on a Friday nights at 9 p.m. lately, you might have noticed that KGLP has a new local show, called Island Time, from volunteer Jon Decker. The show features a variety of Jamaican music - from ska to rocksteady, reggae and dub. We believe that this show is a good fit for the 9 p.m. Friday time slot, as that hour used to be the home of Tropical Reggae with Steve Buggie. Jon has been producing this show since February 2022. He recently moved to the Gallup region from Seattle, Washington.

You might also have noticed that Deer Tracks has undergone some changes. The 20-year-old show has changed from a weekly 3 hours to 2 hours (now Noon until 2 p.m. on Mondays). For the past 6 months, we replaced the third hour of Deer Tracks with Oyate Ta Olowan: Songs of the People (2 p.m. - 3 p.m. Mondays, featuring a variety of Native American stories and songs.) However, since Oyate was a temporary show, we are currently following Deer Tracks, at 2pm, with Gaëñö, a contemporary Native music show from Native Voice One. Gaëñö then repeats on Fridays at 1 pm. In July, Strider marks 20 years on KGLP.

On Being (Sundays at 1 p.m.) is ending distribution after June 2022. We are currently looking for a replacement for this hour. The With Good Reason hour is one possible option, as it matches the tone of On Being, featuring interviews with top scholars, and broaching topics such as the surprising history of the Hawaiian shirt. The program is produced by the Virginia Foundation for the Humanities and has won five Gabriel Awards for Best Documentary or Public Affairs Program.

We welcome the public's suggestions and comments for possible programming on

Sundays at 1 p.m. It is an ongoing discussion and we would love to hear from you.

Our Sunday evening programming remains the same, with Wait, Wait... Don't Tell Me! still repeating at 7 p.m. on Sundays (with first air at 11am Saturdays), followed by On the Media at 8 p.m. We welcome feedback on this lineup, as well.

**Community Involvement:** As our community begins to host more in-person events again, KGLP is eager to get involved. In the past few months, we have recorded several local events for broadcast. Some of these include the Red Rock String Ensemble concerts, Community Health Action Group meetings and Sheriff Candidate Forum. We broadcast the audio from these events on KGLP, and post the recordings to our podcast page.

KGLP supplied wireless microphones, with Emma providing video equipment and producing live multi-camera video streams for several of these events, as Rachel periodically served as M/C. As noted, earlier, we recently purchased a new PA (public address) system, and we plan to use that for even better audio at future community events.

KGLP continues to prioritize community input and feedback. Since our last newsletter, we have hosted two Community Advisory Board (CAB) meetings. The Community Advisory Board is a group of community members that routinely give feedback and suggestions to KGLP staff. At these two meetings, the CAB had a few suggestions: they wanted more local news and more Navajo-language education. We hope to eventually expand on these suggestions, with outreach to bring in more community members who would be able to help with this vision.

If you, as an area resident, are interested in becoming a member of our Community Advisory Board, or might just wish to attend

Silent Campaign Model continues: Many NPR and community radio stations have intense fundraising campaigns known as "pledge drives." Different personalities speak on-air, for 15 minutes or more, telling the audience about the benefits of their station and why they should donate.

For 9 years, KGLP has decided to go with a different model - one that is more low-key and

slow-burning. We call this a "silent campaign." We schedule occasional, 60 or 90-second donation requests and fundraising updates, on-air. We may also request donations through social media. This lasts for several months.

We have found that a "silent campaign" model is most effective for fundraising at KGLP. We broadcast to a very unique listening area, where not all of our listeners are able to donate. Therefore, the "silent campaign" model removes that pressure, and allows for those who are able to donate to fill in the gaps for those who cannot. When you give, you help continue needed broadcast services to those who cannot.

At the time of publication, KGLP has received \$28,000 in donations since mid-October 2021. We are grateful for the support of our listeners, who help keep public radio on-air in this region of the world. Your support makes a difference in many lives.

KGLP's 30th anniversary is coming up this Fall. We are hoping to create some more merch for that occasion, so stay tuned. And if you have any suggestions for premiums, do let us know! Coffee mugs? T-shirts? Key-chains?

Updates from KGLP Staff and Volunteers: Rachel is doing well, and is in the process of renovating her downtown Gallup cottage, occasionally performing comedy at open-mics in the area, as pandemic lockdowns ease.

Emma was promoted to Operations Manager (from Production/Engineering Assistant) in January 2022.
