New Equipment & Tech Updates

After 6 years of preparation, KGLP is still installing our STL (Studio Transmitter Link) system. This system will help convey audio from our UNM-Gallup studio up to Gibson Peak. We have already installed most of the infrastructure in Gurley Hall and Gibson Peak, and are now in the configuration stage, which may take much of this Winter, while we work out the bugs. We are hoping that this new system will reduce the amount of clicks heard on our broadcast.

Silent Campaign Wrapping up

Many NPR and community radio stations have intense fundraising campaigns known as “pledge drives.” Different personalities speak on-air, for 15 minutes or more, telling the audience about the benefits of their station and why they should donate.

For nearly a decade, KGLP has followed a different model - one that is more low-key and slow-burning. We call this a “silent campaign.” We schedule occasional 60 second donation requests and fundraising updates on-air. We may also request donations through social media.

We have found that a “silent campaign” model is most effective for fundraising at KGLP. We broadcast to a very unique listening area, where not all of our listeners are able to donate. Therefore, the “silent campaign” model removes that pressure, and allows for those who are able to donate to fill in the gaps for those who cannot. When you give, you help continue needed broadcast services to those who cannot.

At this time, KGLP has received about \$13,000 in donations since mid-June, 2022. We are hoping to reach our \$20,000 goal by the year's end, but certainly are grateful for the ongoing support of our listeners, who help keep public radio on-air in this region of the world. Your support makes a difference in many lives.

Repeater Stations

KGLP is still in the process of applying for repeater stations. We are looking at potential repeater stations in the Window Rock, Ganado, and Zuni/Ramah areas, and have already applied for rental space on towers in these areas.

This is a lengthy process. It requires a lot of applications, paperwork, strategizing and engineering. The timeline to get these repeater stations on-air could potentially be a few years. We appreciate your patience as we continue to work on this project, and we hope that KGLP may be heard in more places by 2024!
