## NAVAJO AREA INDIAN HEALTH SERVICE COVID-19 VACCINATION SCHEDULE FOR MAY 2022

Window Rock, Arizona --- Navajo Area IHS service units continue to offer COVID-19 vaccines and booster shots at local health facilities to protect our communities. Please see below for a schedule of events by service unit and facility.

COVID-19 vaccinations are recommended for everyone 5 years and older. When eligible, all individuals ages 12 and older should receive a booster dose after completing their primary COVID-19 vaccination. Adults ages 50 and older can also now receive a second booster at least four months after the first booster.

People who are moderately or severely immunocompromised or have weakened immune systems have specific COVID-19 vaccine and booster recommendations. Examples include people receiving active cancer treatment, those who had an organ transplant or stem cell transplant, advanced or untreated HIV infection, those who are taking medicine to suppress the immune system, and others. COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective. Booster doses help strengthen protection against Omicron and other variants. As with vaccines for other diseases, you are best protected again infection with the virus that causes COVID-19 when you stay up to date with your vaccinations. Talk with your health care provider if you have questions about eligibility.

To protect yourself and your loved ones from COVID-19, we recommend that you continue to:

- 1. Wear a mask cover your nose and mouth.
- 2. Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer.
- 3. Watch your distance (keep 6 feet or more apart).

Protecting yourself will help to protect those around you who may not be able to get a vaccinated.

Many of the events listed below, as noted, offer both COVID-19 and Influenza vaccinations. The events are subject to change based on weather and other factors. Bring your COVID-19 vaccination card if you have already received one or more dose.
