About DBMHS


The Navajo Nation Division of Behavioral and Mental Health Services (DBMHS) was established in 1987 as the lead agency for the Navajo Nation to provide comprehensive substance abuse prevention education, treatment & aftercare services for the Navajo Pecole.

The Gallup Service Unit serves the Gallup area & surrounding Navajo Chapter communities.

Our integrated services are provided using a multidisciplinary team approach. The team includes drug & alcohol counselors, MH counselors, and a Traditional Practitioner. The team provides care coordination to address individual needs of our clients as well. Gallup Service Unit includes prevention services which provides prevention education/community outreach, traditional ceremonies, and outpatient counseling.

(1 dose plus 1 booster = Johnson & Johnson)
