ELECTRONIC DEVICES, COMPUTER, & INTERNET ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

Please keep this section for future reference.

With the educational opportunity of electronic devices, computer, and the internet usage comes responsibility. Part of our responsibility in preparing students for the future is to teach them to use wisely these tools.

It is important that you and your student read and discuss the following contract regarding the use of the computer and Internet in our classrooms. It is imperative that procedures for online access are followed. Inappropriate use will result in the loss of on-line and basic computer privileges. We encourage you to discuss with your student that there is unacceptable and controversial material on the internet that could be accessed despite our precautions. Express your family's values to help guide your student's activities while he or she is using internet sources.

SUMMARY OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES, COMPUTER, AND INTERNET USAGE

It is a privilege - not a right - of electronic devices, computer, and internet usage at Heartwood Christian Academy. A signed parent/guardian and student contract <u>must</u> be on file for the student to have computer and internet access.

TECHNOLOGY USE POLICY- The following guidelines define acceptable usage by the administration, teachers, and students at Heartwood.

- All members of Heartwood Christian Academy and the HCA Co-op who use the school resources must act
 responsibly. The school reserves the right to restrict or deny access to its technological resources to those users who
 do not comply with its policies. Violators of these policies may also be subject to appropriate disciplinary penalties.
- Heartwood reserves the right to hold any user accountable for any content on any personal computer regardless of whether the content originated on or off campus.
- Inappropriate access, modification, or use of another student's account or work constitutes a serious breach of school policy.
- While every effort will be made to provide reliable service, Heartwood will not be held responsible for delays, loss of data, or service interruptions. All users are responsible for their own files.
- Parents should note that diligent users might discover controversial or inappropriate materials. The school will take
 reasonable measures to prohibit access to inappropriate materials, but the school cannot totally restrict access to
 these materials and will not be held responsible if a user acquires them.
- Students using a personal data plan on an internet-capable device will be held responsible, while on campus, for any inappropriate activity.

CELL PHONES - Students may have their phones on their person during the school day. However, cell phones should not be used for communication during a class period. When entering a classroom setting, all students should place the device in the area designated by the classroom teacher. In the event of a violation, the following actions will be taken:

- First Offense Phone will be confiscated and taken up by the classroom teacher. Student may pick up the confiscated phone at the end of the class period.
- Additional Offenses Phone will be confiscated and taken to the Administration. Parent / guardian will be contacted. Student may pick up confiscated phone following the contact verification.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES / HEADPHONES /OTHER - Any electronic device used for inappropriate entertainment is not permitted on campus. The use of headphones during co-op should be limited to academic learning and/or to the designated student areas.

RECORDING CLASSES, CONVERSATIONS, AND ASSESSMENTS

8-06-2020 updated

- Students may not use recording devices, including but not limited to computers, cell phones or wearable technology to record
 classes, conversations, and assessments without the express consent of the teacher and all participants in the case of
 conversations.
- Under no circumstance shall a student have an electronic device in their possession during an evaluation unless explicitly
 approved prior to the assessment.

UNACCEPTABLE USES

- Academic Usage
 - a. To copy another's assignments and submit them as one's own, to allow another to access your account to copy assignments.
 - b. To use any electronic device including, but not limited to, cell phones and wearable technology to copy materials used as an assessment tool.
 - c. To copy and distribute commercial software in violation of copyright law.
 - d. To use or distribute copyrighted materials in reports without permission (plagiarism).

Internet

- a. To physically or electronically damage, modify or remove hardware, software, or data.
- b. To create and place any viruses on the school computer or internet.
- c. To use for financial gain, for commercial activity, or for any illegal activity.
- d. To incur on-line charges, to set up fraudulent accounts, to make fraudulent on-line purchases.
- e. To order services or merchandise from other agencies that have internet access.

Heartwood Christian Academy shall not be held responsible for any transactions or be liable for any cost or damages arising out of the actions of students or merchants.

- Personal communication / Speech
 - a. To alter or forward without the author's prior consent.
 - b. To publicize without permission your, or someone else's, home address, phone number, or other personal information.
 - c. To send any anonymous messages of any kind.
 - d. To send and /or receive inflammatory messages.
 - e. To possess, distribute or transmit inappropriate materials.
 - f. To use profanity or obscenity.
 - g. To access a file that contains pornography, inflammatory material, inappropriate material, or any material not specifically related to the instructional lesson, objective, or assignment.
- Security
 - a. To access programs or data without authorization, circumventing or attempting to circumvent login procedures or security,
 - b. To access another user's account or reading another's e-mail.
