Teach your children that God's love never changes and that nothing in this world can separate us from it (Romans 8:38-39). Believing that we are unconditionally loved by our Maker is the first step toward seeing our true, unshakeable identity. Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever.

If I were to put on a sports jersey, I feel a part of the team. My identity is I'm a part of that team. If that jersey has a name on the back of one of the teammates, some act like that player. Or if I get my haircut like a rockstar, I want people to see me as that rock star. I remember when all the girls dressed up like Pat Benetar. They got their haircut like her. They wanted to be Pat Benetar. There was a super star musical kata competitor named Mike Chataratabut. He went by Mike Chat. He was an electrifying tournament competitor. Kids would dress up like him and try and copy him. Nothing wrong with admiring a person, but don't change who you are to be like that person. You don't need to change who you are just to fit in with a group of kids that might not be the best kids to hang out with. Be who God made you then you don't have to hassle trying to be somebody

vou're not.
