WEEK 1 — INTRODUCTION, TOPICAL OVERVIEW AND DIFFICULT QUESTIONS

Topical Overview

Introduction to Joseph's Workshop. Why, what, how, when. Goals and objectives.

Technology and social media – smartphones, burner phones, gaming boxes, screens in general and their associated social media platforms and tools (apps) are raising havoc with many children. These addicting new 'toys' are causing serious and often permanent psychological, social, developmental and academic problems in far too many children.

In this series of presentations, we will cover new technologies that will most likely impact your children. A special session is devoted to artificial intelligence and its implications. We will give best estimates of trends and where these technologies can be expected to be in five years.

New protections are anticipated and some are already available and will be discussed. Ongoing legislative initiatives; teachers unions concerns, and others (E.U.).

WEEK 2 — ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE DISRUPTIONS — WHAT IS A.I.; ITS FUTURE AND OUR GREATEST CONCERNS

What is Artificial Intelligence?

Why now? Why the seemingly sudden interest? Three factors have come together in the past few years and have created a great demand:

- Powerful computing technology: (GPUs, Cloud computing)
- Massive amounts of data (Internet sourced)
- Unlimited money (Tech giants: Google (Alphabet), Apple, Meta, etc.)

This is a very fast-growing business

Unheard of market capitalizations and predictions in the trillions of dollars – with all the attendant temptations and dangers ("The love of money is the root of all evil")

What is A.I.?

- History Where did this thing come from? Failures of some of the early pioneers and how they have been overcome.
- Types of A.I.: Perceptive/cognitive; Generative; Large language; AGI.
- Weaknesses and dangers (Illustration of a typical system, showing four weak spots where developers or others can insert bias.)
- Some common terminology

Applications?

Today there are several dozen A.I. systems in existence in just about every realm of human endeavor. We will only address those that may affect families and children more directly. A few examples: Google Translate, DeepMInd, ChatGPT, Gemini, BARD, Real Estate (Rex), Pornographic and other nefarious applications, Alexa, A.I. that is hidden inside of many current application and robot dolls for children, etc.

The Future of Artificial Intelligence

What new A.I. developments will most affect us?

What is being planned; what are some of the more likely future shocks to our spiritual and earthly existence? A review of current wide ranging academic and business plans, reviews and predictions.

How can we prepare?

What are the dangers? What are A.I.'s faults, limits and weaknesses and how will they affect us? Specifically, our children, our home and family, Dad's job and family income, our parish and our Church, our community, society and our very civilization.

What must parents know and how should they prepare for the coming disruptions? What is the likely future role for our priests and episcopate?

What is currently being done to control and regulate A.I.?

Should there be government regulation? (Every other potential danger in our society already is regulated.) What is the private sector already doing? How should responsible Catholic Christians respond in our public and political arenas?

WEEK 3 — NEW TECHNOLOGY AND SOCIAL MEDIA DISRUPTIONS

New Technology

The end game of technology developers and providers is and always has been to make money. Today, children account for billions of dollars in revenue for companies like Apple, Google (Alphabet), Facebook and TikTok.

Smartphone privacy is a great concern. There are remedies to this and other screen-related problems, such as geotracking but few parents are aware of their availability or are actively using them.

In this section we will also briefly discuss some of the new technology developments you may not be aware of, including medical and quasi-medical devices that can alter behavior.

Social Media

Recent congressional hearings have pointed out that social media is <u>designed</u> to be addicting, such that the users will be encouraged to interact without end. Several studies have shown that this permanently affects and impedes the normal development of both the mental and the physical development of children.

New social media applications are in development. Many of these will be even more addicting and harmful. Parents need tools and advice to protect their children. We will describe some of the more harmful ones and what you can do to protect your loved ones.
