Elohim = God (Mighty Creator, Judge, Ruler)

Meaning & Significance

- Elohim is the first name of God used in the Bible.
- It emphasizes God's power, sovereignty, and role as Creator and Judge.
- Though the word is grammatically **plural**, it is almost always used with **singular verbs** when referring to the **one true God**, indicating **plurality in majesty**—not multiple gods.

Hebrew Breakdown

- **El** = God, Mighty One
- **-ohim** is a **plural ending** in Hebrew, often signifying **greatness or majesty**, but when used to refer to the one true God, it often takes a singular verb.

So **Elohim** implies "the All-powerful, Supreme God" — full of might, authority, and divinity.

Bible Verse (KJV)

Genesis 1:1

"In the beginning God (Elohim) created the heaven and the earth."

This shows **Elohim** as the **Creator of all things**, the One who brings order from chaos.

How to Apply "Elohim" in Daily Life

Knowing God is **Elohim** reminds us that **He is in control** of all creation. When life feels chaotic, remember He spoke the universe into existence — He can speak peace into your storm.

Since Elohim is also the **Righteous Judge**, we can **pray for justice**, trust Him with our pain, and avoid revenge, knowing He sees all.

4. Live with Awe and Reverence:

Elohim's name carries **authority and glory** — so we should live with respect, obedience, and awe before Him.
