Read: Revelation 5, Daniel 7:13–14, Psalm 2



Explain *why only the Lamb is worthy* to open the scroll. How does His authority connect to dominion, judgment, and kingship across these passages?

2.

Read: Revelation 6:1–2, Matthew 24:4–5, 2 Corinthians 11:14



Argue whether the white horse represents Christ or deception. Support your position with *textual evidence and consistency with Jesus' warnings*.

3.

Read: Revelation 6:7–8, Ezekiel 14:21, Jeremiah 15:2–3



Trace the pattern of God's fourfold judgment. Why does God repeat this structure, and what does it reveal about His method?

4.

Read: Revelation 6:3–4, Job 1–2, Daniel 10:12–13



Who truly controls the release of destruction? Explain the relationship between spiritual warfare and earthly events.

5.

Read: Revelation 6:5–6, Leviticus 26:26, Ezekiel 4:16



Analyze famine not just as lack of food, but as **controlled scarcity**. What does this reveal about economic systems under judgment?

6.

Read: Revelation 6:9–11, Genesis 4:10, Luke 18:7–8



Why does God allow the cry for justice to continue before responding? What does this reveal about His timing?

7.

Read: Revelation 6:12–17, Isaiah 13:10, Joel 2:30–31



Are the cosmic signs literal, symbolic, or both?
Defend your position using consistent prophetic language

8.

Read: Revelation 6:15–17, Luke 23:30



Why do people fear judgment but still not repent?
Explain the difference between fear and true repentance.

9.

Read: Revelation 7, Ezekiel 9:4–6, Ephesians 1:13



Compare physical and spiritual sealing.
What does protection actually look like?

10.

Read: Revelation 8:1, Habakkuk 2:20, Zephaniah 1:7



Why is there silence before the trumpets?
What does silence signify in judgment?

11.

Read: Revelation 8–9, Exodus 7–12



Trace at least 5 direct parallels.
Why does God repeat Egypt-like judgments globally?

12.

Read: Revelation 8:7–12, Genesis 1



How does trumpet judgment reverse creation order?
What does this say about God's authority over creation?

13.

Read: Revelation 8:10–11, Jeremiah 9:15



What does "wormwood" symbolize beyond physical poison?

14.

Read: Revelation 9:1, Isaiah 14:12, Luke 10:18



Identify the fallen star.
Is it Satan, an angel, or something else? Defend your conclusion.

15.

Read: Revelation 9:3–6, Job 1:12 Why are demons limited in what they can do?

What does this reveal about God's control?

16.

Read: Revelation 9:20–21, Romans 1:21–25

Compare hardened humanity in both passages.
What leads to this level of spiritual blindness?

17.

Read: Isaiah 13, Joel 2, Amos 5

Compare descriptions.
What consistent characteristics define this day?

18.

Read: Habakkuk 2:3, 2 Peter 3:3–10

Why does God delay judgment?
How should believers respond to that delay?

19.

Read: Hebrews 12:26–27, Haggai 2:6

What is being shaken—and what remains?

20.

Read: Matthew 7:21–23, 1 John 2:28
