Definition	Tuition free course credits toward the Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, or Associate in Engineering and a four year degree.	Tuition free course credits toward an entry level job credential, certificate or diploma for eligible high school students.
Eligibility	1. Be a high school junior or senior; 2. Have a unweighted GPA of 2.8 on high school courses; and 3. Demonstrate college readiness in English, reading and mathematics on an assessment or placement test or meet provisional status.	1. Be a high school Junior or Senior and; 2. Have a unweighted GPA of 2.8 on high school courses or have the recommendation of the high school principal or his/her designee (PLAN scores should be considered); and 3. Have received career pathway information outlining program requirements for completion of the certificate or diploma.
Maintain Eligibility	1. Continue to make progress toward high school graduation, and 2. Maintain a 2.0 GPA in college coursework after completing two courses. 3. A student who falls below a 2.0 GPA after completing two college courses will be subject to the college's policy for satisfactory academic progress.	1. In addition, Bear Grass Charter School does allow 9th & 10th grade students to take Career and College Promise classes *if the Bear Grass Charter School team refers the student to take MCC classes*. For students to be considered to take classes in 9th or 10th grades, students must be labeled Academically Intellectually Gifted (AIG). Once the student is referred, parent contact will be made and the student is then responsible for going to Martin Community College to take the placement test. *If the student scores high enough on the placement test*, BGCS will then collaborate with MCC to schedule classes for the student.
