

#### 2019-2020 Fiscal Year in Review

Center was closed to the public the latter part of our fiscal year. As a result of the Pandemic, all in person and on-site programs are cancelled until further notice. Our staff has shifted priorities to our meals program and serving our Home Delivered Meal recipients. We deliver to 70 clients 3x's per week and still growing. Our meal count is up to 500 per week as of June. We are offering up to 2 meals p/day and we have partnered with the food bank to allow our clients to shop for food and essential items 2 times per month. We provide shopping assistance to those who need it. We keep in touch by phone with our clients to ensure they are taken care of and have what they need.

During the 2019-2020 Fiscal year we received a Grant and private donations that allowed us to upgrade our Security System, enhancing our alarms, adding cameras and upgrading our outside lighting system. We received a Grant from Clackamas Workforce Program that has allowed us to purchase, laptops, and other equipment that will assist us with social distancing, build out virtual programs and as we open support small group programs. Other Grant assistance for Personal Protective Equipment from Franz Bakery and Gilbert Fund. In addition, we received donations from the Fire Department and American Legion to purchase an AED.

We appreciate the generosity of the community to help us help others especially during this time of uncertainty. As we planned our next fiscal year budget it was challenging, so we plan to review it quarterly and revise as needed.

#### 2020-2021 Fiscal Year plans

Three Main Center Priorities as we begin our new Fiscal Year

#### Engagement - How do we stay connected with our clients?

Some engagement ideas—Plan and implement virtual programs, virtual small groups "coffee chat", small group trips, exercise classes, box lunch pick-up, and care calls.

#### Safety—How do we keep our employees, volunteers and clients safe?

Access to Personal Protective Equipment. The Board is working on Grants and funding while staff is working on donations. Implemented protocols for dealing with safety in the kitchen, bus and volunteers for Home Delivered Meal delivery. Working on a policy for dealing with non-compliance once we begin to open.

#### Emotional Health—How do we fit in to help our team, volunteers and clients with wellness health?

Assisting our clients with concerns around isolation, depression and lack of motivation. Some ideas include; Providing resources and create wellness packets with information, crossword puzzles, exercise examples.

Your continued assistance and support keeps our team of employees and volunteers motivated to help others in our community. We thank you for partnership with helping us fulfill our mission.


