July Horticulture moment:

TOMATOES: Pruning or not pruning tomato's... suckers or not?? determinate or indeterminate.. I did a few videos of a determinate (a determinate amount of tomatoes will be produced) and an Indeterminate (they will keep producing an indeterminate amount) tomato with the pruning I do.

If you don't like listening to videos this is basically what I say: determinate will get bushy and do not need pruned unless you want to keep them neater which is what I do (shown in video) Indeterminate I prune the lower branches but leave the suckers as it will produce tomatoes (shown in video) as I do with determinate tomatoes. I will start pruning any new suckers in early July as it won't have time to produce.

Disclaimer: I have grown in Fairbanks for over 20 years (14 years in my own garden). I get 100-300 lbs of tomatoes a summer and grow inside a greenhouse and outside in raised beds but I am not a master gardener.












The request this month, July, is the following:
