I. Designs

Guidelines: Designs tell the story of the class title. Plant material used in a design does not have to be grown by the exhibitor. Accessories and bases may be used. Only one entry per class per exhibitor. All designs must contain fresh plant material. Artificial plant material is not to be used. Space available for each design – maximum 20”wide x 20”deep. See the FGC website for the Robert Service poems that make up the theme and class titles for this Show. The 5 classes are:

1. The Spell of the Yukon

A dried arrangement highlighting gold

2. The Shooting of Dan McGrew

A fresh design including an element(s) that would be found in a saloon

3. The Cremation of Sam McGee

A fresh floral design depicting the Northern Lights

4. The Law of the Yukon

A creative floral design including vegetables and/or herbs

5. The Call of the Wild – Youth (Under 18 Years)

An arrangement incorporating wildflowers

II. Horticulture (Flowers)

Annuals, Perennials, Biennials, and Container-Grown Plants

Guidelines: All flowers are to be fresh and grown by the exhibitor. There is to be only one entry in each flower type and size per exhibitor. Containers should be clear, preferably colorless glass bottles, provided by the exhibitor. Foliage may be left on, but not under the water. Flowers may be wedged to help them stand up straight.

- 3 blossoms on individual stems shall be required for flowers under 2”.
- 1 blossom on a stem is required for flowers 2” and larger.
- If flowers grow on a spike (a central stem with the flowers growing directly on it), multiple flowers on 1 spike are allowed.
- Dahlias, marigolds, and sunflowers shall be divided into small, medium, and large blooms.
- Roses shall be divided into hybrid tea, grandiflora, floribunda, miniature, and rugosa. For roses, multiple flowers on 1 stem are allowed.
- Container-grown plants shall be in the exhibitor’s care for at least six weeks.
