Maki. The band also performs the mega hit, "Under Pressure", showcasing backup singer, JD in a duet with Thomas.

He went on to compose at the age of 12, and has written music with multiple bands/acts since, most notably, Exit 232, Like A Villain.

Raised in the Farmlands of Pa, JD's singing would be heard echoing throughout the tree's and mountains like a songbird. JD signed up for Choir in both Grade school and High School but yearned to play an instrument, the Flute to be exact. Money was tight, so the only instrument she had was her voice. 


