What is Return to Breeder Agreement? Every responsible breeder hopes that the homes they send their puppies to are their homes for the duration of their life. Unfortunately, sometimes life events are out of our control. Sometimes things like illness, Deployment moving overseas, divorce, or financial problems lead people to a situation where keeping a dog in their home is not in the dog's best interest. If something like this were to occur, County Line Kennels Min Dachs "return to breeder agreement" ensures that the dog's best interest is considered if a change of living situation is needed. We will accept any puppy back that came from County Line Kennels Mini Dachs, but a refund WILL NOT be given.

Notes regarding return:			

There is a big difference between a Responsible Preservation Breeder and an irresponsible breeder. Sometimes referred to as "backyard breeders", irresponsible breeders breed dogs without much effort in breeding selectively and are generally doing it to make money or simply for the experience of raising puppies. A responsible preservation breeder is someone who is dedicated to contributing to the preservation and improvement of their Miniature Dachshund breed.

Note to Buyers ~

As some new families must travel a long distance to get back to their home which requires stopping at rest areas or gas stations, County Line Kennels Mini Dachs HIGHLY recommends that you **DO NOT** take your puppy into a pet walk area, also once home AVOID dog parks or spaces where other dog's feces can be found. The reason for this is because your new puppy has only had one of their series of three puppy shots and are not fully vaccinated from the Parvovirus. Your puppy has been dewormed four times but can easily pick up other parasites from these areas. **AVOID AT ALL COST!** Parvovirus can be brought into these areas by older dogs with no symptoms of the virus. Parvovirus in canines (dogs) is a highly contagious disease that can be fatal to puppies. Puppies aged six weeks to six months are most at risk! Parvo attacks dogs' cells in their intestines, meaning they become severely dehydrated and weak. There is NO CURE. The Parvovirus family of viruses are particularly long-lived in an environment, lasting anywhere from one to seven months – commonly surviving five to seven months in an outside environment.

There are also other parasites that could harm your new puppy with little to no symptoms, so it is best to have them potty in an area that looks to have no other signs of other animals. If you have questions about this information, please ask!
