What it did.

- Established that the King did not have unlimited powers over the people.
- Created a formal, written communication of grievances to the King.

Why is it relevant today?

- Led to government by consent.
- Framework for the Accountability Clause of Article 1 of the Bill of Rights

The Mayflower Compact

What it did.

- Provided for a government of, by and for the people; Plymouth Colony.
- Established government by consent.
- Stated intent to bring Christianity to North America.

Why is it relevant today?

- Led to the gospel of Jesus Christ being preached in the colonies, and the subsequent churches.
- Led to religious freedom as protected by Article 1 of the Bill of Rights.
- Established the principle of Article I, Section 1.

The Boston Tea Party

What happened.

- Colonists debated their grievances regarding taxation from British Government.
- The Sons of Liberty protested by throwing the East India's tea into the Boston Harbor.

- How did the British respond?
