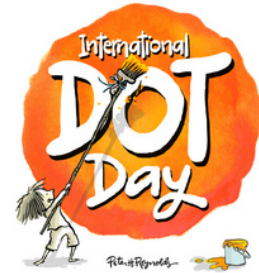

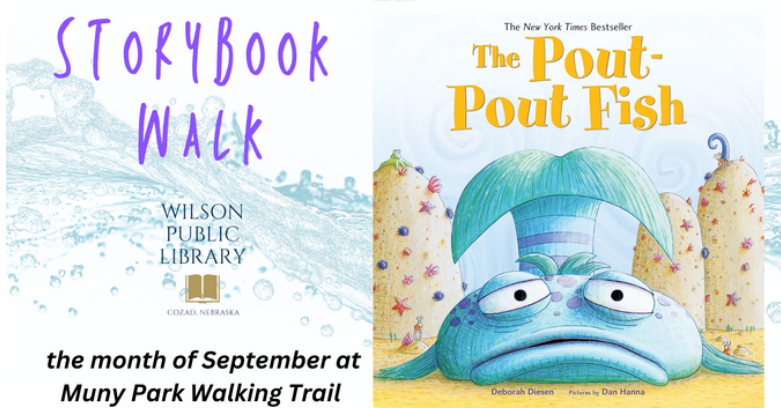

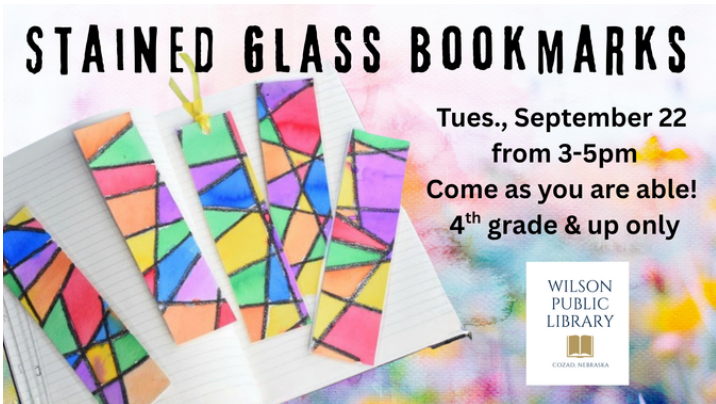

Join us to make stained glass bookmarks with watercolors on Tuesday, September 22 from 3-5pm. Come as you are able! 4th grade and up only. No registration required.



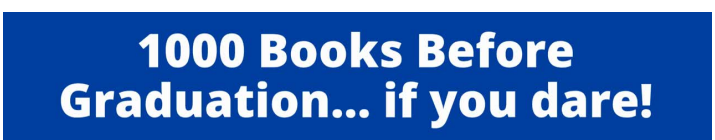
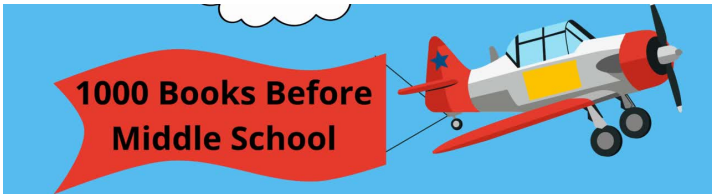
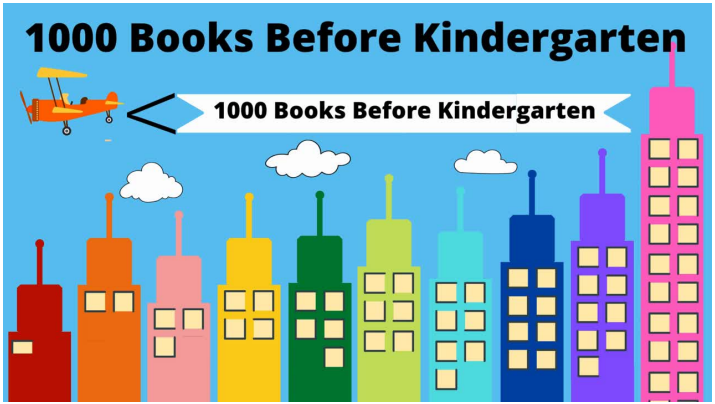
