Our mission is—and will remain—focused on empowering young women through scholarship, service, and leadership. We expect those associated with our program, past or present, to reflect the principles of integrity and respect in both word and deed.

On a personal note, I want to express my deepest condolences for Erika Kirk, whom I first met years ago when she was a young woman competing in Arizona. Learning of the tragic death of her husband, Charlie, is heartbreaking, and my heart goes out to her and their children during this unimaginable time.

We encourage our community to rise above division and to embody the grace, strength, and kindness that define the very best of Miss America.
