

Becoming A DELEGATE

For over 100 years, Miss America has been shaping the future, breaking barriers, and empowering women to shatter glass ceilings. What began in 1921 as a "bathing beauty review" was an act of rebellion during a time when women weren't permitted to wear swimsuits in public, challenging societal norms and pushing boundaries. As time passed, Miss America evolved into a dynamic service organization with a steadfast commitment to community impact. In 1945, it transformed the landscape by awarding scholarships instead of cash prizes, becoming one of the first organizations in the U.S. to provide college tuition scholarships to women. In the 1980s, the program solidified its legacy by making community service a foundational pillar, raising millions of dollars and driving awareness for causes that continue to make a difference across

- Earn scholarship funds for your educational goals.
- Develop important life skills in interpersonal communication, advocacy, and composureunder-pressure, to name a few.
- Engage in community service initiatives and develop a sense of civic responsibility.

Higibility TO COMPETE

Beginning August 2025, potential Delegates must meet the following criteria to be eligible to compete:

Miss Texas



Age:

Delegates must be no older than 28 years of age as of September 30, 2026 and no younger than 18 on September 1, 2026.

Residency:

Must fulfill ONE of the following:

- Must reside in the State of Texas for 120 days
- Or be enrolled in and physically attending classes on a full-time basis at an accredited college or university,
- Or be employed on a full-time basis, in-person in the State of Texas for 120 days

Citizenship:

Must be a citizen of the United States of America.

Miss Texas' Teen



Age:

Delegates must be no younger than 14 as of September 1, 2026 OR no older than 18 on September 30, 2026.

Residency:

Must fulfill ONE of the following:


- Must reside in the State of Texas for 120 days
- Or be successfully enrolled in and attending classes on a full-time basis at an accredited public or private school, or home schooled within the State of Texas

Citizenship:

Must be a citizen of the United States of America.

Documentation:

All forms of documentation required for eligibility verification remain unchanged. These updates are designed to provide clarity and consistency across all local, state, and national competitions. For further information, delegates should contact their local or state director.



Private INTERVIEW

Each Delegate engages in a private (10) minute, press-conference-style interview, comprising 30% of their total score. Each Delegate will submit a one-page Fact Sheet and Community Service Initiative Essay that will make up most of the content of the interview. Judges will have the opportunity to ask questions based on these forms, as well as follow-up questions to learn about a Delegate's unique aspirations, educational and career goals, opinions on current events and social issues, as well as their interests, hobbies, and extracurricular activities.






Wardrobe - Delegate's choice:

- An outfit that best represents your personality.
- Must be age appropriate.
- Professional looks are recommended.



On-Stage CONVERSATION

This portion of the competition allows the audience to truly get to know the Delegate by bringing some of the conversation from the Private Interview to the stage. After the Private Interview, a judge will write a follow-up question for the Delegate to be asked later on in front of an audience. **This phase will make up 10% of the total score.** For our local competition, the Delegates will be wearing their Opening Production Number outfit, so there will be no need to purchase extra wardrobe for this phase.





Wardrobe - Cocktail Dress:

- Wear a cocktail dress of choice and heels.
- You will be dancing in this outfit, so make sure you are comfortable, able to move, and remain appropriate while on-stage.

Heath & FITNESS

The Miss America and Miss America's Teen Organizations are partnered with the American Heart Association to promote the importance of women's heart health. This phase is an opportunity for each Delegate to showcase her commitment to health and fitness initiatives, and to support a few of the official partnerships of the Miss America Organization. This phase comprises 20% of a Delegate's overall score and all competitors are required to wear Rebel Athletic wear from the Miss America Collaboration Collection.





Evening GOWN

The Evening Gown portion of competition is worth 20% of each Delegate's total score, and is an opportunity to showcase their unique style and command of the stage. Scoring is based on how the Delegate carries herself and the overall impression of her ability to represent the Miss America or Miss America's Teen Organization at high profile events. The scoring will NOT be

based on the attire itself nor the estimated cost of the wardrobe.





Wardrobe - Delegate's choice:

- Model your choice after what you might wear to a red carpet event.
- Make sure to select shoes and alterations that would allow you to walk freely across a stage.

Tajent / HERstory

Each Delegate may perform a 90-second performance talent or HERstory stage presentation, making up 20% of her final score. This allows insight into the Delegate's preparatory, performance, and storytelling skills. Judges will evaluate how engaging and compelling a performance is, how effectively a Delegate connects with the audience, and how powerfully the Delegate delivers their story/demonstrates their talent.




