Work Starts On New 85 Footer In Aluminum


The way things have been going the past few years you're never sure which Burger holds the title of largest all welded aluminum cruiser built in this country. The only sure bet is that it is a Burger.

First it was the 72' JIG-MIL . . . then the 75' SOUTH SEAS. Burger then built two 83 footers including the recently launched COMPROMISE. Now Burger has announced that work is progressing on an 85' aluminum yacht.

This new 85 footer is a Hargrave design as were all of the other title holders. The boat will be launched next summer.

Still to be launched this year in the Yard's annual race with winter is a new 72' aluminum cruiser. This yacht is a sister ship to JIG-MIL.

BURGER BUILT BOAT GOES TO SCHOOL AFTER 25 YEARS

Grand Valley State College, of Grand Haven, Michigan, welcomed a floating coed to its campus this Fall — a 50 foot diesel-powered Burger. Dr. James Zumberge, president of the college, said the boat-gift, donated by Mr. Don Angus, a retired manufacturer and engineer from Indianapolis, will be used for scientific studies of the Great Lakes.

A Quarter Century Old
