Against the backdrop of South Africa's youth unemployment crisis, a bold new initiative is taking shape to turn the tide. The Future of Jobs Summit™ brought together 200 influential public and private sector leaders to co-create solutions for the jobs of the future — with a firm focus on youth employment, digital skills, and scalable solutions. Leading technology giant SAP, alongside major job creation enablers such as the Graduate Institute of Financial Sciences (GIFS), ABSA Group, North-West University (NWU), Afrika Tikkun, and the Youth Employment Service (YES) unveiled their bold strategies and pragmatic programs for attracting, developing, and retaining top talent in an increasingly competitive global market.

SAP in particular showcased its globally acclaimed Programmes, which have already equipped thousands of young Africans with in-demand digital skills and meaningful career pathways. These initiatives are helping to create an inclusive talent pipeline that fuels both local innovation and international competitiveness.

Spearheaded by the Future Leader Forum, under the direction of its founder Dr Nik Eberl, the Future of Jobs Summit™ is a high-impact platform for action and alignment. Bringing together CEOs, Ministers, labour leaders, skills providers, and community champions, the summit is structured around a singular mission: to create a sustainable and inclusive South African workforce.

"Youth unemployment is the greatest threat to our democracy — and the greatest opportunity to unlock national prosperity," said Dr Nik. "This summit is about co-creating jobs of the future through partnerships that work — and delivering those solutions at scale."

Special Mention: The President's G20 Address

Following the Global Leaders G20 Summit held in Johannesburg on 28-30 November 2025, President Cyril Ramaphosa quoted extensively from the Future Leader Forum's G20 Visitor Experience Report in his Address to the Nation.

Said President Ramaphosa: "Participants of the G20 who attended from other countries experienced the friendship, hospitality and generosity that defines our nation and our continent. Many visitors commented on the vibrancy, warmth and hospitality of our people. Some had this to say, **as related by Dr Nik Eberl, who wrote:** "Your people are extraordinary. A German delegate commented: "I've attended summits on six continents. I've never experienced warmth like this." A Japanese delegate had this to say: "Your security guards smile while being vigilant. Your drivers share stories while navigating. Everyone — from the protocol officers to the coffee vendors — treats us like welcomed family, not foreign dignitaries." Commenting about our Ubuntu philosophy one trade representative said: "In other countries, hospitality is a transaction. Here, it feels like a tradition."

A French delegate shared something profound: "We came to discuss economic frameworks. But what we'll remember is how your people made us feel. That's not soft power — that's real power." **Dr Eberl concludes by saying:** "This weekend, the world's most powerful people aren't talking about our GDP or our credit ratings. They're talking about our people. **And that's a currency no economy can print.**"



Opening Keynote Address by The Gauteng MEC of Economic Development, Agriculture and Rural Development



In her keynote address at the 2026 Future of Jobs Summit™, Hon Vuyiswa Ramokgopa, Gauteng MEC for Economic Development, Agriculture and Rural Development, emphasized that the future of South Africa depends on its ability to invest in young people and create an economy capable of absorbing their talent, creativity, and ambition.

Using Sandton as a powerful symbol of transformation, the MEC reflected on how the financial hub was built through vision, innovation, and the collective efforts of thousands of people, arguing that every great city and nation is ultimately a product of its people and the scale of their ambition.

Drawing on her own journey from a teenage sales assistant to entrepreneur and public leader, MEC Ramokgopa spoke about the importance of restoring hope among young South Africans. She noted that while youth unemployment remains one of the country's greatest challenges, with unemployment rates exceeding 45% and even higher among young people, it also presents an extraordinary opportunity. With more than 60% of Africa's popu-

lation under the age of 35, the continent possesses an abundance of creativity, innovation, and potential that can drive future economic growth.

The MEC outlined Gauteng's Economic Growth and Development Plan 2030, which aims to increase economic growth to between 3% and 5% and create up to 410,000 additional jobs. The strategy focuses on 12 high-growth sectors, including advanced manufacturing, ICT, business services, agriculture, logistics, tourism, green industries, fintech, renewable energy, and the creative economy. She stressed that job creation must be viewed not only as employment placement but as the development of sustainable ecosystems, infrastructure, and value chains that can support long-term prosperity.

Concluding with a call for collaboration between government, business, academia, and civil society, MEC Ramokgopa urged leaders to ensure that young people can imagine a future for themselves in South Africa. **She announced a commitment to create 10,000 youth jobs** during Youth Month and reaffirmed that the future of jobs is ultimately about building a society where opportunity, inclusion, and hope are accessible to all.

Opening Keynote by SAP: From Skills to Scale



Lance Williams (Public Sector Lead at SAP South Africa) delivered the Opening Keynote titled "From Skills to Scale: How Technology and People can re-write South Africa's Economic Story". Lance shared a compelling call to action on one of

South Africa's most pressing challenges: youth unemployment. He highlighted that 4.7 million South Africans between the ages of 15 and 34 are unemployed, warning that prolonged unemployment erodes skills, confidence, and future opportunities. Drawing on global data, he argued that the challenge is not insurmountable but requires deliberate interventions that move young people from unemployment to training, certification, employment, and ultimately economic participation.

Williams outlined SAP's response **through a four-pillar skills development framework**. The model begins with community technology centres that provide digital access and foundational skills, followed by the SAP Learning Hub, which offers free learning resources and certification opportunities.

The third pillar, the Educate to Employ programme, connects learners with structured training and job placement opportunities through partnerships with organisations such as UNICEF, EY, Deloitte, Accenture, Capgemini, and Coursera. The flagship Young Professionals Programme has already trained thousands of graduates globally and boasts a 95% placement rate.

A central theme of the presentation was the role of artificial intelligence. Williams argued that AI should empower people rather than replace them, enabling workers to become more productive and innovative. He stressed that **South Africa's opportunity lies in developing future-fit skills** that align with the growing global demand for digital and AI-related expertise.

The presentation concluded with a call for greater collaboration between universities, employers, government, and civil society. Williams encouraged education institutions to embrace free digital learning tools, employers to hire certified graduates, and organisations to invest in community-based skills development initiatives. **His message was clear:** South Africa has the talent, resilience, and innovation needed to compete globally, but success will depend on collective action to unlock opportunities for the next generation.

Keynote Address by Melvyn Lubega (Head of the Digital Service Unit in The Presidency)



In his Keynote Address: **Building South Africa's Future Through Digital Infrastructure**, Talent and Opportunity, Melvyn Lubega highlighted that South Africa stands at a defining moment in its history. For the first time, the country is confronting two powerful forces simultaneously: the largest youth population in its history and an unprecedented wave of technological transformation driven by artificial intelligence and digital innovation. How South Africa manages this intersection will largely determine its economic trajectory over the next two decades.

While youth unemployment remains alarmingly high, Melvyn challenged delegates to look beyond the statistics and recognise the human reality behind them. Every unemployed young person represents untapped talent, ambition and potential. **The challenge is not a shortage of talent**, but a shortage of opportunity. Melvyn argued that traditional approaches will not solve a modern employment crisis. "You cannot solve a digital economy problem

with analogue thinking," the speaker noted, calling for a fundamental shift in how South Africa approaches job creation. Three strategic priorities were identified.

The first is digital infrastructure. Just as roads, railways and electricity enabled economic growth in previous generations, today's economy requires digital infrastructure, including trusted digital identity, secure payments, affordable connectivity and integrated data systems. By reducing the friction that prevents individuals and businesses from participating in the economy, digital infrastructure becomes a powerful enabler of entrepreneurship, innovation and employment.

The second priority is talent acceleration. South Africa has no shortage of capable young people; rather, it faces a shortage of pathways into opportunity. The speaker argued that employers should increasingly assess candidates based not only on qualifications but on their ability to learn, adapt and solve problems. In a rapidly changing economy, adaptability is becoming more valuable than credentials alone.

The third priority is building an ecosystem of opportunity. Sustainable job creation requires closer collaboration between government, business, education and technology partners to create scalable pathways into employment, entrepreneurship and innovation. Individual initiatives, while valuable, will have greater impact when aligned within a broader national ecosystem. The keynote also addressed the growing influence of artificial intelligence. While acknowledging that AI will transform some occupations, the speaker emphasised that history shows technology consistently creates new industries and new forms of work. The greatest risk is therefore not AI itself, but failing to equip people with the skills needed to work alongside it.

SAP Centre Stage

A key insight from the SAP Panel was that **technical skills alone are no longer sufficient**. Successful employability programmes combine digital and technical capabilities with mentoring, coaching, communication skills and real-world business exposure. Connecting young people directly with employers and industry professionals creates an ecosystem where learning translates into employment opportunities.

Artificial intelligence featured prominently throughout the discussion. While acknowledging concerns about automation, panelists agreed that **AI should be viewed as an enabler rather than a threat**. The future workforce must learn to work alongside AI, using technology to improve productivity, creativity and problem-solving. Continuous learning, adaptability and lifelong reskilling were identified as essential attributes for remaining employable in a rapidly changing labour market.

The panel further emphasised **the importance of collaboration between business, education providers and technology partners**. Professional services firms possess significant capacity to train talent at scale, while employers have opportunities to create structured pathways into employment.

Building Africa's Future Workforce

The SAP-hosted panel explored one of the Summit's central challenges: how to bridge the gap between education and meaningful employment in an era of rapid technological change. Bringing together leaders from business, technology and the Young Professionals Programme, the discussion highlighted practical approaches to preparing young people for the future world of work.

A recurring theme was that youth unemployment is not simply a shortage of jobs, **but a shortage of pathways into employment**. While South Africa has an abundance of talented young people, many lack access to the industry exposure, digital skills, professional networks and workplace experience required to transition successfully into employment.

The representative from EY emphasised that investing in graduate development is not merely a corporate social responsibility initiative **but a strategic business imperative**. As organisations grapple with ageing workforces and widening digital skills gaps, bringing young talent into the workplace introduces fresh thinking, new capabilities and greater organisational resilience.

The discussion also demonstrated **the transformative impact of structured employability programmes**. Participants shared personal journeys of moving from uncertainty and unemployment into successful careers through SAP's Educate to Employ and Young Professionals Programmes. Beyond technical certification, these initiatives build confidence, workplace readiness, mentoring relationships and industry networks, enabling graduates to contribute from their first day of employment.

The Economic Impact of 2026 Future of Jobs Summit™

The 2026 Future of Jobs Summit™ demonstrated that its greatest value extended far beyond a single day of dialogue. It successfully convened a critical mass of influential leaders and institutions with the collective capacity to shape South Africa's economic future. Following the first three editions of the Annual Future of Leadership x Jobs Summit (2023-2026),

- **54 leading local and global brands** participated in the Summit;
- representing an estimated **R2.5 trillion in economic activity** across key sectors of the economy;
- Collectively, these organisations employ **more than 500,000 people**;
- And influence over **R1 trillion in procurement spend**, giving them significant leverage to stimulate inclusive growth, create employment opportunities and accelerate skills development.

This level of participation positions the Summit as **one of South Africa's most influential multi-stakeholder platforms** focused on the future of work, future skills and future industries. The organisations represented reflected a broad cross-section of the economy, including business, government, higher education, technology, entrepreneurship and civil society. This diversity reinforced one of the Summit's central conclusions: the future of jobs cannot be addressed by any single stakeholder acting alone. Sustainable employment requires coordinated action across the entire economic ecosystem.

Beyond the numbers, the Summit reached an important conclusion: **South Africa's greatest challenge is not simply unemployment** - it is preparing people for the jobs, industries and opportunities of the future. The Summit has already catalysed the next phase of action, including the following initiatives:
