Nominations closed!

Nominations closed on 21st September, with 24 candidates throwing their hats into the ring. Ten candidates are running in the Tarwin Valley Ward, 7 in Strzelecki and 7 in the Coastal-Promontory Ward.

Each candidate was obligated by the Victorian Electoral Commision to lodge a Candidate Statement, which included their vision for South Gippsland in 50 words. In this edition of the Digest we have included each candidate's stated vision along with a few main news articles.

"To date, not one candidate for the council election has made a commitment to drastically overhaul this bloated bureaucracy and establish a culture of real community service at a cost which represents value for money."


Forward-looking vision Sentinel-Times 13/9/21
