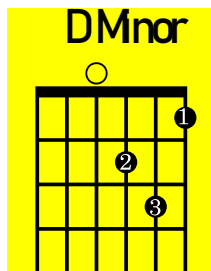
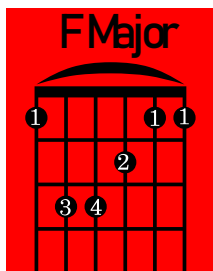
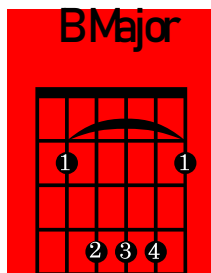
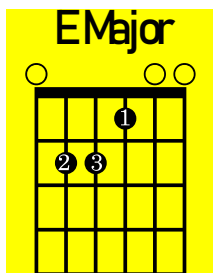
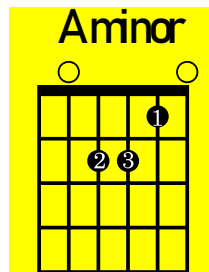
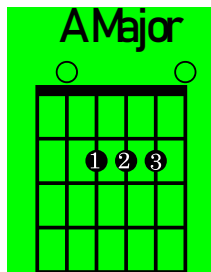
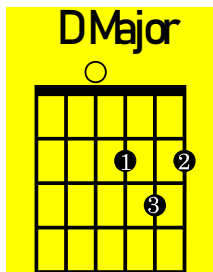
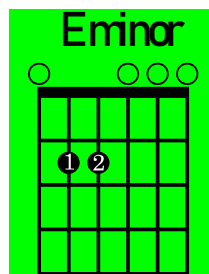
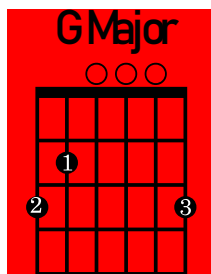
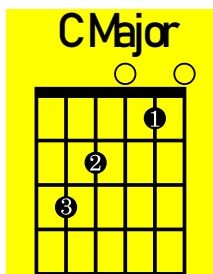


Beginner Chords



There are thousands upon thousands of chords that are in existence. Mostly, they are one particular chord played in different positions on the guitar fretboard; but there are tons of fun sounding chords, easy chords and difficult chords. In this lesson you are going to want to focus on these chords to begin your guitar journey. Here are the chords:



Things to know

Chords have been labeled **GREEN** for easy, **YELLOW** for medium difficulty and **RED** for max difficulty.

When playing chords you need to follow these rules:

1. Only press the string and fret that you are instructed to, with the proper finger shown on the chord chart or diagram. (a circle means that the string must be played open)
2. Curve your fingers
3. Play with the finger tip. (No Pain, No Gain!)
4. Leave a little space between the fretboard and your hand.
5. Keep your thumb pointing upwards in the back of the neck. DONT Grip Tightly.
6. An arch between 1's in the diagram means you must use your whole 1st finger.
