


STAFF vs TABS

The best way to think of the "STAFF" is to think of it as a map for musicians. Notes will show up on the staff either on a line or a space. Then the musician locates that note on their specified instrument. In this case we are working with the guitar. **Below this explanation you will find a "map guide" if you will that will tell you where to play the note that you see**

"Tabs" is like the key to the staff map. Notice how there are six lines instead of 5, like the staff. That is because tablature lines represent the 6 string on your guitar. **Very important: the 1st string is the thinnest string, and the 6th string is the thickest string**. When a number shows up on the tablature it is telling you what fret you can find that note in.
