



SONOITA REGION

The Sonoita region is Arizona's first American Viticultural Area (AVA). The area was designated an AVA for its similarities to the Indicazione Geografica Tipica region of Italy, known for its "Super Tuscans." The unique geographical location, climate and soil characteristics of the Sonoita AVA produce award-winning Sauvignon Blanc, Cabernet Sauvignon, Malbec, Merlot and more. Because of the region's natural water retention, and the cool air blowing over the mountains, the Sonoita AVA offers exceptional conditions for producing wine.

With a dozen tasting rooms throughout the region, the vineyards and wineries of the Sonoita AVA invite you to discover a new taste of Arizona.







WILLCOX REGION

Between 4,200 and 5,500 feet in elevation, the vineyards of the Willcox region of Arizona offer a near-perfect climate and soil for growing grapes. Located in the Southeast corner of the state, and high above the desert terrain and heat, this area is surrounded by the Dragoons, Chiricahua and Dos Cabezas mountain ranges. Receiving an average rainfall of 15-20 inches combined with the mountain minerals that are part of the soil, it is here that 74% of Arizona's wine grapes are harvested. With several world-class tasting rooms, there are plenty of places to find your next favorite.





Verde Valley Itinerary

MORNING —

Enjoy a shaded courtyard on Cottonwood's Main Street while you dine on red-velvet waffles with beer-battered chicken and amazing chilaquiles at Crema Café.

Take a water to wine tour by kayaking along a scenic stretch of the Verde River and make your way to the Tuscan farmhouse at Alcantara Vineyards for wine tasting.

AFTERNOON -

Enjoy a late picnic lunch at Page Springs Cellars where they make everything from wine to the mustard and sausage you'll find on their charcuterie boards. pagespringscellars.com

Spend the rest of your afternoon visiting the tasting rooms that line Main Street in Cottonwood, including Arizona Stronghold, Carlson Creek, Burning Tree and Pillsbury Wine. www.netrail.com

EVENING —

Walk under the stars on an easy hike down to the Verde River on the Old Town Jail Trail found right off Main Street. 1101 N. Main Street (Parking and trail head)

For a memorable dining experience, visit Merkin Vineyards Osteria and try their famous prickly pear infused mac & cheese.

Sonoita Itinerary

MORNING -

Start your day with a homemade cinnamon roll or savory breakfast at the Horseshoe Café & Bakery. This diner serves classic breakfast fare starting at 6 a.m. horseshoecafe-bakery.com

Travel South on Hwy. 90 to discover Kartchner Caverns State Park. This stalactite wonder, discovered in 1974, was kept a secret for four years until young cave explorers shared the pristine cavern with the property owners. Book an advanced tour reservation for your visit.

Head to downtown Sonoita and visit the tasting rooms and vineyards. Looking to try something different? Swing into Flying Leap Distillery to taste cask-aged brandies, vodkas or bourbon made from wine grapes. The hand-hammered copper stills are manufactured in Germany. flyingleapvineyards.com

AFTERNOON —

When you get hungry, but are too engrossed in the wine you're sampling, simply order an antipasto platter delivered to you from the Café. cafesonoita.com

EVENING ---

After a day of experiencing the local wines, head to The Steak Out Restaurant & Saloon for a fine cut of steak cooked over a mesquite grill. Take in the old west elegance and unwind from a day of exploring Southern Arizona. azsteakout.com

For unique accommodations, consider one of the region's wineries. Purveyors such as Kief-Joshua Vineyards and Dos Cabezas Wine Works have their own suites. If a lodge is more your speed, stay at the one-of-a-kind Sonoita Inn. sonoitainn.com

Willcox Itinerary

MORNING -

Start with a visit to a Sky Island for an early morning hike. Starting east of Willcox, you can explore nature at the Chiricahua National Monument and gaze at the wonderland of rocks. Or go southwest of Willcox and hike the Dragoon Mountains; beware of the ghost towns within. nps.gov/chir

AFTERNOON -

Head to the country store at Apple Annie's Orchard for lunch, served Monday – Friday. Try a daily soup, sandwich or seasonal wrap. Save room for their homemade pie. While on the farm, participate in their "you-pick" fruit crops and select from apples, peaches and pears.

Arrive at Old Town Willcox and explore the tasting rooms in the historic town center along the Willcox Wine Trail. Tasting rooms here open around 11 a.m.

Leave your mark on Willcox by adopting a vine. Exclusive to Birds & Barrels Vineyards, you have an opportunity to meander into the vineyard and choose a grape vine of your choice to adopt.

EVENING -

Mexican fare doesn't get any more authentic than what you'll find at La Unica Tortilleria Y Taqueria. Wander in from the tasting rooms to indulge in large portions and light, crispy tortilla chips.

Make sure to ask for the hot salsa.
