





The bond between two sister cities comes alive within both sides of the border including its name origin. The name Nogales comes from the Spanish word "walnut" and Walnut trees once grew abundantly in the mountain pass between the city of Nogales, Arizona and Nogales, Mexico.

Today, the lively culture of Nogales is accredited to its deep roots of religion, western expansion, art and music thanks to the many walks of life that are proud to call Nogales home.







TIMELINE

1692

Jesuit priest Eusebio Francisco Kino founded the Guevavi mission near Nogales.

1774

Juan Bautista de Anza (Trail) began by taking approximate 200 settlers and their escorts including cowboys, translators, mule packers, Native American guides and over 1,000 head of livestock to San Francisco, creating missions along the way.

1841

Land grant from the Mexican Government to the Elias family established Los Nogales de Elias.

1853

The Gadsden Purchase made Nogales part of the United States of America.

1880

Russian immigrant Jacob Isaacson built the first trading post.

1904

Nogales Courthouse was built under Sheriff Tom Turner.

1914

Nogales occupied by Pacho Villa during the Mexican Revolution.

1918

The first walls, splitting Nogales were built concluding of battles between US Army and Mexican militia which had taken place since 1913.
