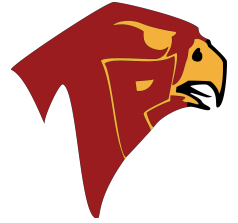




Torrey Pines Falcons (0-0)

vs. Westview Wolverines (0-0)

9 Facts to Know:

1. The Falcons enter the season as the defending San Diego Open Division CIF Champions! In February's final, Torrey Pines beat Foothills Christian 51-47 at UCSD's RIMAC Arena to give the Falcons' their 7th CIF Title in Boys Basketball. Meanwhile, the Wolverines fell to Bonita Vista 66-52 in last year's San Diego Division II title game.
2. Coach John Olive begins his 23rd season at the helm for the Falcons. His career record is 502-175, which includes three CIF San Diego Section Titles. Opposite him, Westview's Kyle Smith will be starting his 11th year as their head coach.
3. The Falcons are 21-3 against the Wolverines since Westview opened its doors in 2002. The Falcons beat the Wolverines in last season's matchup at Westview, 79-31. The last win for the Wolverines came on January 7th, 2012 at Torrey Pines.
4. Junior Nick Herrmann (#1) will be making his triumphant return from bone cancer in this game. Herrmann missed all of last season as he recovered from two rounds of chemotherapy and a major surgery.
5. The Falcons enter this season as the only school in San Diego to make the semifinals of the Open Division every year since its advent in the 2013-2014 season. Torrey Pines is also the only *public* school to make every Open Division playoff bracket.
6. Exactly one week ago, Senior Brandon Angel (#21) signed to play basketball at Stanford University. Angel will be the first Torrey Pines Basketball player to ever suit up for the Cardinal.
7. The Falcons lost four of their starting five from last year: Bryce Pope (CIF San Diego Player of the Year), Michael Pope (All-CIF San Diego First-Team), Noah Viera and Ryan Brown. Angel (#21) will be the only returning starter from last year's championship team.
8. In the 2018-2019 season, all three levels of Torrey Pines Basketball combined for a record of 76-8. Varsity was 25-7, JV was 28-0 and Freshman was 23-1.
9. The Falcons graduated 10 of their 16 players from last season. The Wolverines graduated seven of their 13 roster members from last season.
