

Torrey Pines Falcons (2-1) vs. West Hills Wolfpack (1-1)

9 Facts to Know:

- 1. The Falcons now stand at 2-1 on the season with wins over Westview and El Centro Southwest and a loss in their last game to #8 Mater Dei Catholic. West Hills has opened 1-1 after an OT win against Granite Hills and a loss to Serra. Granite Hills will be the next opponent for Torrey Pines (Wednesday Dec. 3rd).
- 2. West Hills only graduated two seniors from last season's 11-14 team. All 10 other players from that team return this year and are joined by three new juniors and a freshman to round out their roster of 14 players.
- 3. The Falcons have played the Wolfpack thrice in the last 15 years, all in the West Hills Tourney. All three games have gone to the Falcons by double-digit margins.
- 4. The last time Torrey Pines and West Hills met was the kickoff of the Falcons' 2016-17 season. The Falcons defeated the Wolfpack 80-40 with four players breaking into double digits: Jake Gilliam (21), Ethan Esposito (16), Hayden Helfrich (12) and Finn Sullivan (10).
- 5. Brandon Angel (#21) recorded his first double-double of the season with 16 points and 14 rebounds in last Wednesday's game at Mater Dei Catholic. Angel had six double-doubles last year as a junior.
- 6. In the CIF San Diego Section, Chris Howell (#5) ranks 8th with 4.3 assists/game and 6th with 3.3 steals/game. Of Falcons who have appeared in all three games so far this season, Nate Witte (#2) leads the team with a 5:1 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- 7. After finishing 10-3 at home last season, the Falcons are 2-0 in the Olive Garden to start this year. This is the Wolfpack's first road game of the season after going 3-5 last year.
- 8. Program-wide, the Falcons are a collective 7-1. This week is busy, as Varsity will play three games (Mon/Weds/Sat), JV will play eight times (Mon/Tues/Weds x2/Thurs/Fri/Sat x2) and Freshman will play twice (Weds/Fri).
- 9. After missing the entirety of last season as he went through two rounds of chemotherapy and a surgery for bone cancer, Nick Herrmann (#1) has started all three games for the Falcons and is averaging 12.0 points per game while shooting 74% from the field.
