



# Game Recap #1 (San Diego High)

Wednesday March 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021  
Torrey Pines High School

## The Quick Hit:

Torrey Pines opened up a 24-10 lead after the first quarter and never looked back. San Diego got hot from behind the three-point line in the third quarter, but the Falcons' 21 point lead at half was more than enough to sustain the third period run en route to an 84-50 win.

## The Players:

Otto Landrum scored in every quarter to lead the Falcons with 17 points. He also contributed eight rebounds on 8/10 from the field. Nick Herrmann had a 10 point second quarter on his way to totaling 15 points and four rebounds. Diego Campisano was the third Falcon in double figures with his 10 points and six rebounds. Chris Howell was three points short of a double-double, finishing with seven points and 10 assists. Nate Witte added an efficient nine points on 4/5 from the field. In all, 11 of the 13 Falcons who appeared in the game scored at least one basket.

## The Game:

The Falcons opened up the season with a 6-0 flurry, including a Chris Howell steal and two-hand slam. The first quarter ended much the same way as it began – a flurry of Falcon baskets. Cameron Klein led all scorers with eight points in the opening period on 3/3 from the field, including two buckets from deep. After one, it was 24-10 Torrey Pines. The second was dominated by Nick Herrmann and his 10 point quarter. Logan Huston provided a nice spark off the bench with five points shortly after checking in. Chris Howell had seven assists in the first half to pilot the Falcons to a 45-23 lead at the break. In the third quarter, San Diego's offense came alive as they knocked down multiple three-pointers. A.J. Burgin, an Idaho State-signee for the visiting Cavers, was a key catalyst of their big run. He had 23 points in the game before unfortunately exiting with an ankle injury midway through the third quarter. Diego Campisano had a big eight minutes, including two three-pointers, as the Falcons and Cavers tied the third at 17 a piece. A great moment came with 1:37 to go in the third when Sebastian Fayer, a senior Falcon who suffered a brutal knee injury in June 2019 and missed all of the last season, checked in to the contest. After three, it was 62-40 Torrey Pines. In the fourth, the Falcons' starters exited with five minutes to go. Cooper Glenn shined bright with five points and three rebounds in his five minutes of action as Torrey Pines went on to win 84-50.

Torrey Pines will host Mt. Carmel in game #2 of the season on Friday, March 26<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm. The Sundevils will travel west on the 56 for the Falcons' first cross-league North County Conference game.
