

## Torrey Pines Falcons (7-0) vs. Corona Centennial Huskies (1-0)

## 9 Facts to Know:

- 1. Torrey Pines is now 7-0 on the season after picking up a 39 point win Wednesday at home over Temecula Valley. Corona Centennial has only played one game thus far in 2021 a win over Great Oak, also coming by 39 points.
- 2. In what will be a rare fact for games against schools across Southern California, Torrey Pines has never played Corona Centennial. Despite playing in the National Division of the Holiday Classic together for several years, the Falcons and Huskies will finally face off for the first time.
- 3. This will only be the third time in five seasons Corona Centennial has played a San Diego Section team. On November 26<sup>th</sup>, 2019, the Huskies beat the Mikey Williamsled San Ysidro Cougars 94-41. The prior season, on January 12<sup>th</sup>, 2019, the Huskies beat Mission Bay 74-68.
- 4. The game will feature at least four division I players. For the Falcons, senior Chris Howell (#15) is signed with Saint Mary's College, and junior Otto Landrum (#22) currently holds five DI offers. For the Huskies, sophomores Kylan Boswell (#4) and Jared McCain (#24) both hold multiple DI offers.
- 5. The Falcons have been hitting the offensive glass, averaging 12.4 offensive rebounds per game. That's an increase from 8.2 in 2019-2020 and would shatter the previous record for a season of 9.0 averaged per game in 2017-2018. Otto Landrum (#22) leads the Falcons with 3.3 offensive boards per game.
- 6. After his incredible stat line was highlighted in the last preview, Chris Howell (#15) went out and posted a 9 point, 7 rebound, 8 assist effort on Wednesday against Temecula Valley in only three quarters of play.
- 7. Wednesday's 90 point output was the Falcons' highest of the season and moved their season average up to an astounding 79.9 points per game. In seven games, Torrey Pines has already posted a point differential of +197 (559 for/362 against).
- 8. Nick Herrmann (#1) is the Falcons' leading scorer at 19.4 points per game. After only having one 20+ point game his junior season, he has already recorded four so for this season after putting up 21 on Wednesday in only three quarters of play.
- 9. Tonight is the second tripleheader (Frosh/JV/Varsity) of the week for the Falcons. After sweeping Wednesday's set against Temecula Valley, the program is now 14-1 overall. Varsity is 7-0, JV is 3-1 and Frosh is 4-0.
