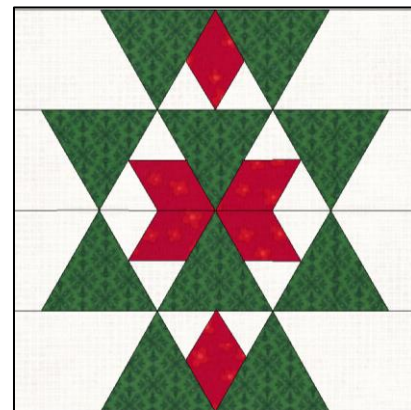
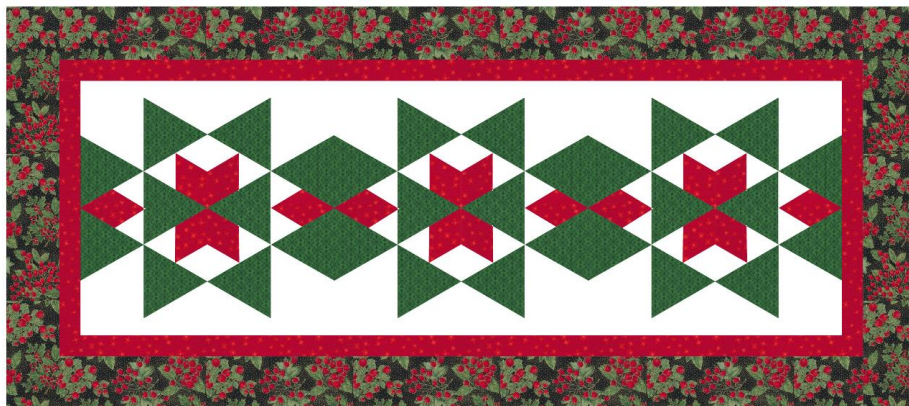


Nested Star Table Runner

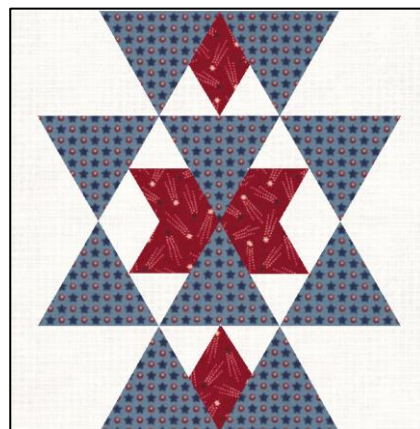
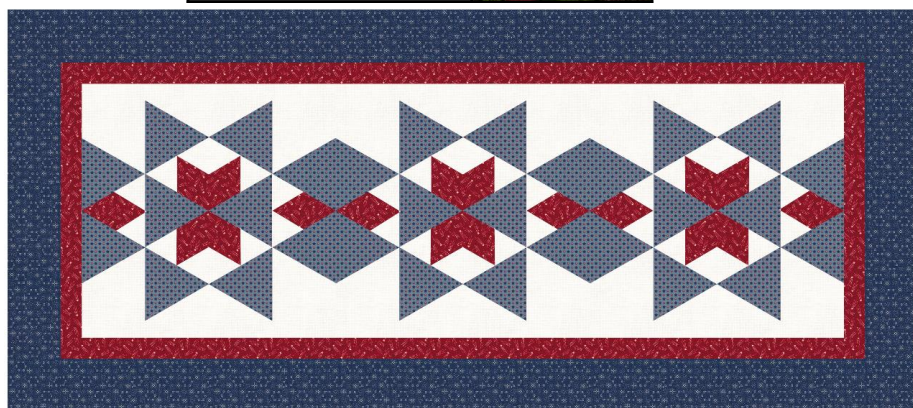
Take your 60 degree skills to the next level and learn the Nested Star Technique while creating this beautiful table runner. Once you have learned this technique the design possibilities are endless.

Project Size: 19" x 43" Table Runner

Required: Six in a Square® Tool and Nested Star Sprint

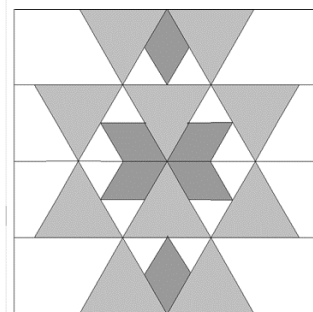
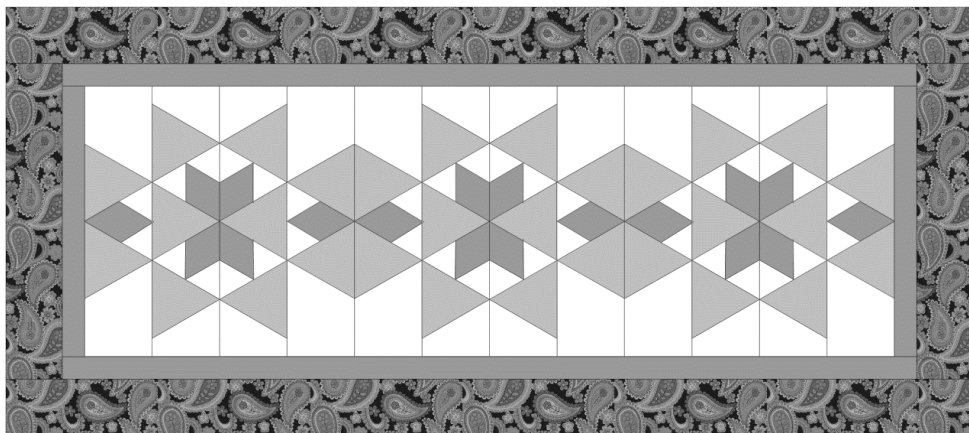

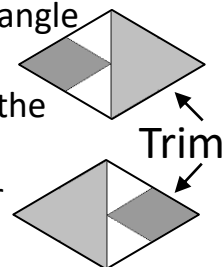

FABRIC	UNITS	CUTTING	
Dark ¼ yard	Small Star Points	(2) 2 ¼ " WOF	Cut 18 Star points
	Inner Border	(3) 1 ½ " WOF	(2) 1 ½ " x 38 ½" and (2) 1 ½ " x 12 ½ "
Medium ¼ yard	Triangles	(2) 4 ¼ " WOF	Cut 30 triangles
Background (Light) 1/3 yard	Small Triangles	(2) 2 ¾ " WOF	Cut 18 triangle pairs
	UNIT 2/3 Background	(3) 3 ¾ "	Cut into (12) 3 ¾ " x 8"
FOCUS ¼ yard	Outer Border	(3) 3" WOF	(2) 3" x 38 ½" and (2) 3" x 19 ½"

Binding	1/3 yard
Backing	1 ½ yard

1. Using the SPRINT make 18 nested star points.

2. For STEP 8 – Trim (12) with the Large Medium Triangle as the outer edge and trim (6) with the small dark star



point as the outer Edge.

3. Layout the block prior to assembly, paying attention to the direction of the star point.

4. Assemble and trim the 3 blocks following the tool

5. Referring to the Table Runner image, stitch the 3 blocks together, pressing the seams open.

6. Stitch on the borders and press toward the border strip. Stitch the shorter sides on first then the longer sides.
