Make-up, Costume, Performance Information

Meet at 5:30 have a quick practice run through and then perform the dance 2 times.

Costume: This will be lots of fun! Consider this an art project.

- Step 1- Begin by selecting old, well-worn, and beat-up clothing. Search local thrift stores to find old shirts and pants for your zombie costume or use clothing of your own that you don't mind destroying to make your costume, Choose oversized clothing that can be torn and tattered. You may want to make your costume more unique by choosing a specific zombie person such as a football player, or cheerleader (you could use an old Halloween costume). You do not have to buy a costume (A Little Drama will always try to provide a costume or make it very easy to make or get a costume)
- Step 2- Tatter the clothing - Use scissors to fray shirts, tear holes, and rub dirt and grass on clothing. Splatter brown or red paint for effect.
- Step 3- Make sure your child can dance in their costume. No masks (we have been working on facial expressions)

Makeup: The #1 rule of zombie makeup is that you can always add just a bit, but you can't remove just a bit

Face: apply powder to protect the skin from the makeup. Use a little white, gray, or light foundation

Eyes/Cheeks: Shadow the eyes so they appear sunken. You can do this with eyeliner or black eye shadow. Dab a little under the eye on the top bone of the lid and toward the sides of the nose. Gently rub into the skin. Contour under the cheekbones as well.

Lips: Paint the lips black or leave then plan

ADD Fake blood

- I know some performers may not like looking scary- That is ok- being cute will always be a crowd pleaser:)
- Makeup comes off easily with baby oil- Some children may have a reaction to the makeup (applying powder all over their face first may help) if you prefer not to wear makeup. That is fine.
