Dear Director Poole,

Every single child, family and veteran in the state of Alabama needs a safe, affordable place to call home. As you consider how to distribute \$55M of remaining state Fiscal Recovery funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), we strongly encourage you to support affordable housing agencies from across Alabama. Specifically, we ask you to invest \$25M in allocations to existing grantees of CDBG, ESG and HOME grants.

It is clear to the undersigned organizations that the COVID-19 pandemic only worsened the harm to families resulting from a lack of safe, affordable homes. According to a recent analysis from the Low Income Housing Coalition of Alabama, our state <u>lacks over 86,000 affordable</u> <u>housing units</u> for people living with extremely low incomes. Currently, there are 170,510 extremely low-income households but only 84,148 affordable rental homes available to them. Those who are lacking this housing option are mostly working, disabled, and/or senior citizens.

We know robust investments in affordable housing will provide strong benefits for people across Alabama. Greater access to higher-quality jobs, goods schools, childcare and medical care are just a few examples of how affordable housing in every community is critical not only for an individual's quality of life but for the state's economic development and prosperity.

We urge you to invest \$25 million in affordable housing, to be distributed via ADECA, today. If more revenue replacement funds are available for this purpose, this would allow these funds to go even further to match existing federal funds. These investments will make Alabama a better place to live and work for years to come.
