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## **Colin Appleton, Club Boatman, Retires**



Next time you're down at the Club, take a look at the control tower. You probably know it was constructed in 1967 to Vic Basil's award-winning design but you may not be aware that the commemorative plaque on the tower was made by Colin Appleton. Colin's fabrication expertise was honed over many years working for Sheet Metal Services in Litherland, and these skills were put to good use during his time as Club Boatman. There seemed to be no limit to what Colin could fix and we are grateful to Colin for the many hours he spent tinkering with boats and engines to keep them in good order.

His skill on the water is equally legendary. Gill Pinch recalls a daring rescue in the surf off Ainsdale Beach. Whilst racing on the tide, the wind got up and the Enterprise she was crewing with her husband capsized, the mast driving into the sand and snapping. Gill and Graham were trapped under the mainsail for a few terrifying moments before Colin's reassuring voice was heard above the storm. Taking charge, Colin helped 'right' the boat and towed it to shore, before quickly putting back out to sea to rescue

several other boats in similar distress.

Colin's family is responsible for manufacturing the cannons which start the 24-Hour Race, scale replicas of those recovered from Henry VIII's flagship, the Mary Rose. Colin recalls

accompanying his father on a VIP tour of the historic ship to present one of the guns to Margaret Rule, the archaeologist most associated with the project to raise the vessel from the Solent in 1982. Colin was given a behind-the-scenes tour and enjoyed the privilege of getting up close to the wreck and he recalls being allowed to draw one of the longbows on display – much to the envy of less distinguished on-lookers.

The armaments were also the cause of a hospital visit when the gunpowder he was loading into a cannon flashed, causing burns to his face. Fortunately, his father and brother were on hand and no serious injury resulted. On another occasion, challenged to see how far a projectile would travel whilst testing the firing mechanism outside the Clubhouse, Colin was delighted when a squash ball disappeared over the Lakeside Inn.



After many years of service, Colin has decided the time has come to retire from his duties as Club Boatman. The Committee is delighted to make Colin an Honorary Member of the Club, and we hope he will remain a familiar sight around the Club now that he will have more time to devote to sailing his RC laser.

## WLYC 24 Hour Race

The 24 Hour Race is a very special, iconic event which sets the West Lancashire Yacht Club apart. We can be proud that competitive sailors are eager to return once more and support the UK's premier dinghy sailing endurance race. Along with our Streaker and GP14 Open event on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> May, the 24 Hour Race will bring renewed excitement to our racing calendar.



Many of our own Club members know the event very well; others are new to it. As we prepare for the 53<sup>rd</sup> edition to take place on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> and Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> September, this interim update explains some of the working assumptions for this year's event and we'll issue further updates during the year.

We'll retain all the spirit and excitement of the traditional WLYC 24 Hour Race on the water, whilst streamlining some onshore facilities. In many cases we'll follow the tried and tested template of years past. What is going to change more significantly is that, in common with the spirit of the times, we'll adopt an innovative, collaborative model in running the event, sharing some of the organisational load and learning from the best practice of other sailing clubs and organisations.

The RYA have been extremely helpful in advising us on race management and generating publicity for the event at the RYA Dinghy Show in February. We're grateful to the GP14 Association who are managing online entry for teams sailing both Enterprises and GP14s, and the Enterprise Association have also supported the publicity.

We expect to run the event with a minimum of 40 and a maximum of 75 boats, with both GP14s and Enterprises. We're asking all clubs which enter a team to provide some trained resources, to help us make the event safe and enjoyable, though we anticipate WLYC members will play a lead role in each area in which the visiting clubs contribute resources to the duty rota, including powerboat, timekeeping (observing), scrutineering, reception, site management, first aid and race officials. Budworth Sailing Club have stepped up to help organise the duty rota together with the competing clubs. It's going to be teamwork and all the more fun because of it. Being able to count on this generous support, and the enthusiasm of the clubs who want to take part, has given us the confidence to proceed with the event.

We're working closely with Southport Sailing Club (SSC) on results reporting. Roger Smith of WLYC and Dave Baxter of SSC and their teams will run the hybrid Baxter-Smith scoring system for both the SSC 12 Hour and 24 Hour Races, so that we can keep learning and adjust the system based on the experience of each event.



We will need to provide some entertainment, catering (likely to be largely outsourced) and sanitation facilities, as well as the race management and essential safety infrastructure. Administration will be online to a great extent – our ambition is to be paperless – and this could include advance registration and race declarations taking place online - with details still to be worked out. If this proves to be possible, it will also help us to manage the workload on the day.

Accommodation will be limited for visiting sailors since Waterside Lodge will be unavailable for camping this year. There may be a small amount of shelter and camping space in the dinghy park, and beyond SSC's clubhouse. We will ask the council to provide extra parking spaces and encourage visiting teams to use camper vans. In order to maintain our own sailing season

through to the Monkhouse Cup. It's our hope to accommodate Club members who are regular sailors wishing to keep their boat in the dinghy park. We'll update Club members on the detailed plans nearer the time.

This team race provides club sailors a different level of challenge, fun and experience. It complements the other two great dinghy sailing endurance events hosted by the hardy sailors of the northwest of England. Leigh and Lowton Sailing Club (LLSC) are welcoming club teams to Pennington Flash in Greater Manchester, for the Sunrise to Sunset (S2S) Race on 8th June. It will be a chance for sailing clubs to practice ahead of the WLYC 24 Hour Race in September, and we hope WLYC will be able to enter a competitive boat for the LLSC S2S, as well as competing again in the National Junior 12 Hour Race, hosted by Southport Sailing Club (SSC) on 29th June.

All Club members are very welcome to participate in the event as competitors, supporters and/or spectators. This is a good time to express your interest if you have not already done so. If you wish to lend a hand before, during or after the 24 Hour Race, please contact the Commodore, Richard Westlake. If you wish to compete in the Streaker and GP14 Open event, the LLSC S2S Race, the SSC Junior 12 Hour Race and/or the WLYC 24 Hour Race, please inform the Dinghy Captain, Ian Donaldson.
