RESOLUTION

REGARDING ACKNOWLEDGING THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF MASON, TENNESSEE

- WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen for the Town of Mason, Tennessee (the "Board"), sent an email in June of 2024 to conduct a Special Called Meeting during which a motion was made, seconded, and passed for Mayor Noeman to step down as Mayor;
- WHEREAS, Mayor Noeman subsequently filed a Complaint against certain members of the Board to challenge his removal as Mayor;
- WHEREAS, pursuant to the Charter of the Town of Mason, Tennessee (the "Town"), the Town has enacted a mayor-aldermen charter;
- WHEREAS, pursuant to the Tennessee Code Annotated §§ 6-3-101, et seq. and the Charter of the Town, the Board does not have the authority to remove the Mayor via Board vote;
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3 of the Charter of the Town, the Board may declare a vacancy exists if the Mayor or an Alderman resigns, dies, convicted of a felony, etc.;
- WHEREAS, pursuant to the Tennessee Open Meetings Act, any Special Called Meeting must have adequate public notice, include topics to be discussed, provide an agenda that reasonably describes meeting discussions or votes, and limit discussions during the meeting to those items explicitly listed on the agenda;
- WHEREAS, the Town, the Board, and the Mayor desire to promote the unique values of the Town and encourage working together to achieve said common goal.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Mason, Tennessee, meeting in regular session on the 16th day of June, 2025, in Mason, Tipton County, Tennessee, that:

<u>Section 1</u>: The Mayor and the Board will collaborate to promote the values of the Town of Mason, Tennessee to the public.
