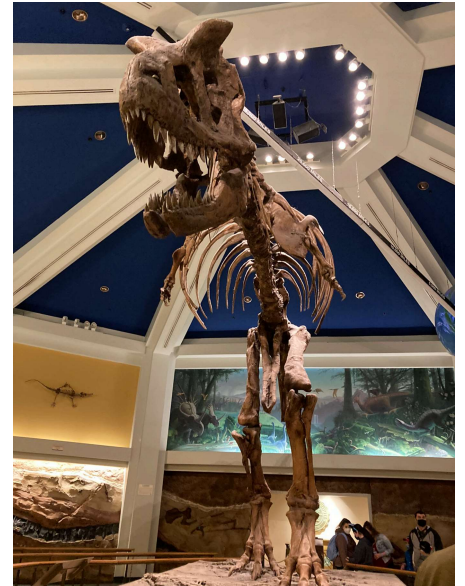

- Seasonal resort collections

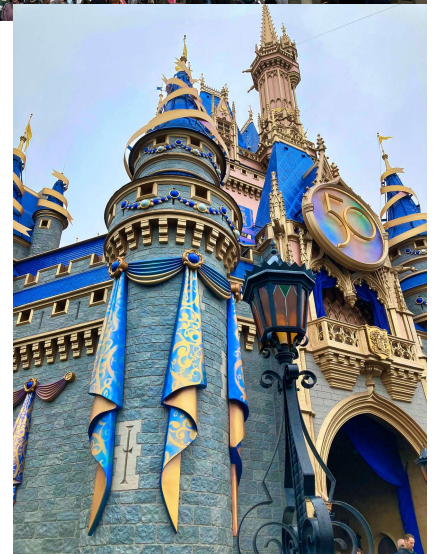
