ORDINANCE NO. 94/107 B

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE CONTROL OF BURNING OF GARBAGE AND REFUSE

WEREAS, the Village Board of Galatia, Illinois, has ware of increased incidences of burning of garbage and refuse, and,

WHEREAS, the Village Board recognizes the need to provide the means of accomplishing effective control over said burning in order to promote the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village of Galatia,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and the Village Board of the Village of Galatia, Saline County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE: DEFINITION. The terms "garbage" and "refuse" as used in this ordinance are hereby defined as follows:

Garbage: offensive matter, dead animals, refuse made from a kitchen or store, non-combustible trash and food scraps.

Refuse: combustible trash, yard and street trimmings and refuse.

<u>SECTION TWO: PROHIBITION.</u>

A. It shall be unlawful for any owner and/or occupant of property to permit the open burning of garbage on any property.

property to permit the open burning of garbage and/or any other refuse material including material which would otherwise be legally burnable, after the hour of 6:00 p.m. each evening until the hour of 6:00 a.m. the following morning. Persons convicted of violating this Section shall be punished according to the terms of Section Three below.

SECTION THREE: VIOLATIONS - PENALTY. Any person convicted of a violation of this ordinance is guilty of a petty offense and shall be fined not less than Ten and No/100 Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Five Hundred and No/100 (\$500.00).

SECTION FOUR: It is the intention of the Village Board the Village of Galatia, Illinois, that this ordinance and every provision thereof shall be considered separable, and the in alidity of any section, clause or provision of this ordinance shall not effect the validity of any other portion of this ordinance.

SECTION FIVE: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.
