Our mission at Heartspace Kids is to support the healthy social, emotional, and academic development of children, teens, and young adults through counseling and education.

Heartspace Kids was founded by Dina Mark, a Licensed Professional Counselor who has witnessed first-hand the high demand for affordable and accessible mental health services for youth in our community. After establishing a private practice of her own, Dina began to lay the foundation for a nonprofit organization that would serve youth by providing them with the financial assistance needed to access therapy and educational services.

Fast forward to 2021, Heartspace Kids was born. Since our official launch in 2021, the board, staff, and therapists at Heartspace Counseling Center have worked hard to establish our Kids First Fund, provide quality therapy services, develop new programs, connect with the community, and increase our organizational capacity. As we head into our third year we look forward to a year of more growth and giving!

Our Vision

Our vision at Heartspace Kids is that all kids and their families will have access to high-quality mental health services and educational resources at a cost they can afford.



Individual Counseling

Individual therapy sessions are offered for children, teens, and young adults. We offer a variety of therapeutic approaches to best suit the needs of each individual. We recognize that each person is unique, and treatment should always be personalized and adjusted to meet them where they are. Individual therapy can help with: stress management, anxiety reduction, depression, family changes, trauma, behavior issues, and more.

Kids First Fund

Our Kids First Fund provides access to essential mental health care and critical educational resources to kids in need in our community. Financial assistance is based on annual household income along with other qualifying criteria and is exclusively for kids ages 18 and younger or kids up to 21 years of age who are receiving special education services.

Educational Therapy

Educational therapy is a specialized form of intervention designed to support children and adolescents with learning differences or educational challenges. The main goal of educational therapy is to help children overcome barriers to learning and build the necessary skills to become successful, independent learners. We work closely with students to identify their unique strengths and weaknesses. By understanding each child's individual needs, we tailor interventions and strategies to optimize their learning experience.

Groups and Workshops

Heartspace Kids offers a variety of groups and workshops throughout the year, including social/emotional learning, stress and anxiety management, executive functioning, mindfulness and yoga, and parenting skills/education groups.

Summer Camps

Mighty Minds summer camp will teach essential life skills in a fun, engaging, and developmentally appropriate way. Our camp is traditional in the sense that our days will be filled with arts and crafts, music and movement, and fun and games! What makes our camp unique is the social and emotional learning embedded into our programming.



The Kids First Fund was established in January of 2022. Since that time, Heartspace Kids has awarded over \$70,000 in financial assistance to youth and families in need right here in El Paso County, Colorado.



Heartspace Kids provides in-house therapy and educational services to meet a wide variety of individual and family needs, including individual therapy, groups and workshops, and summer camps to youth ages 3-19.

Over 85 underinsured and economically disadvantaged youth were provided low-cost or free therapy services.

Youth Mental Health In Colorado

of Colorado youth with major depression do NOT receive any mental health treatment.

40,000 Colorado youth who are covered under private insurance do not have coverage for mental or emotional difficulties

COLORADO RANKS 28TH

in the Nation for children younger than 19 years not covered by private or public health insurance

OVER Colorado youth are experiencing **46.000** severe major depression.

Youth experienced numerous hardships during the COVID-19 pandemic. The CDC's Adolescent Behaviors and Experiences Survey (ABES) found that 67% of U.S. high school students reported that schoolwork was more difficult, 55% experienced some emotional abuse in the home, 11% experienced physical abuse, and 24% reported they did not have enough food to eat during the COVID-19 pandemic, all of which can have a detrimental effect on mental health.
