FROM PASTOR MUSE

"...one puts new wine into fresh wineskins." Mark 2:22

It has been very clear, for quite some time, that we have been living into a new reality. There are many names for the moment we are experiencing; new normal, post-covid, the covid life, the list keeps going and going. I have often said that things are different now. That difference will be reflected in how we live together as a community.

We have been blessed over the past 12 months to come back together and join our voice in song, first with distancing and masking, now with more open expression. It is a joy to be able to be together again and continue to offer our online expression. Word and sacrament are faithfully being presented at St. Paul's.

Yet, as we move forward, we have not seen the same number of in-house worshipers as before the arrival of Covid -19. There are many and various reasons for this. Some may have grown accustomed to worshipping online, others may not feel comfortable coming back together, and still, others may desire a different expression of faith. Each option, made in faith, is valid. We love all who are with us in person and those online. We also love those who have chosen a different road. However, this trend will affect decisions for the future of the ministry.

One such decision has to do with the number of worship services we offer each week. For example, in prior years, our regular worship schedule would reengage on Labor Day weekend, with two worship services offered each Sunday. However, as we have witnessed since the return to public worship, we are more than capable of providing faithful worship and room for all with one service.

One service during the summer has brought people together. Given us the ability to more fully lift our voice together to praise God and feel the energy of the Holy Spirit flow through us. Bringing the two services together has been a beautiful gift. It gives a more complete feel to the communal expression, which we wish to extend.

On the recommendation of the Music and Worship Committee, the Church Council has voted to approve one service on Sunday morning this fall. We will maintain our current worship time of 9:30 am each week. This will be followed by fellowship (see pg. 2) and education (see pg. 3). The community will continue to gather for one service into the foreseeable future. We will monitor the number of people attending worship and the CDC guideline as the pandemic unfolds and shows new

SEPTEMBER 2021—The Word of God in Worship

September 5, 2021 TIME AFTER PENTECOST — LECTIONARY 23 INTRODUCTION

James tells us to stop showing favoritism in the assembly, treating the rich visitor with more honor than the poor one. Jesus himself seems to show partiality in his first response to the Syrophoenician woman in today's gospel. Was he testing her faith in saying Gentiles don't deserve the goods meant for God's children? Or was he speaking out of his human worldview, but transcended those limits when she took him by surprise with her reply? Either way, the story tells us that God shows no partiality. Everyone who brings a need to Jesus is received with equal honor as a child and heir.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Gracious God, throughout the ages you transform sickness into health and death into life. Open us to the power of your presence, and make us a people ready to proclaim your promises to the whole world, through Jesus Christ, our healer and Lord.

READINGS AND PSALM

Isaiah 35:4-7a, Psalm 146, I will praise the LORD as long as I live. (Ps. 146:2), James 2:1-10 [11-13] 14-17, Mark 7:24-37

September 12, 2021 TIME AFTER PENTECOST — LECTIONARY 24 INTRODUCTION

Three weeks ago we heard Peter's confession of faith as told in John's gospel. This week we hear Mark's version, when Peter says, "You are the Messiah." In John, the stumbling block is Jesus' invitation to eat his flesh, given for the life of the world. In Mark too the scandal has to do with Jesus' words about his own coming death, and here Peter himself stumbles over Jesus' words. But Jesus is anointed (the meaning of messiah) in Mark only on the way to the cross (14:3); so we are anointed in baptism with the sign of the cross.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

O God, through suffering and rejection you bring forth our salvation, and by the glory of the cross you transform our lives. Grant that for the sake of the gospel we may turn from the lure of evil, take up our cross, and follow your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

READINGS AND PSALM

Isaiah 50:4-9a, Psalm 116:1-9 I will walk in the presence of the LORD. (Ps. 116:9) James 3:1-12, Mark 8:27-38

September 19, 2021 TIME AFTER PENTECOST — LECTIONARY 25 INTRODUCTION

Today we hear James warn against selfish ambition, while the disciples quarrel over which one of them is the greatest. Jesus tells them the way to be great is to serve. Then, to make it concrete, he puts in front of them a flesh-and-blood child. We are called to welcome the children God puts in front of us, to make room for them in daily interaction, and to give them a place of honor in the assembly.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

O God, our teacher and guide, you draw us to yourself and welcome us as beloved children. Help us to lay aside all envy and selfish ambition, that we may walk in your ways of wisdom and understanding as servants of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

READINGS AND PSALM

Jeremiah 11:18-20, Wisdom 1:16—2:1, 12-22 (Alternate), Psalm 54, God is my helper; it is the Lord who sustains my life. (Ps. 54:4), James 3:13—4:3, 7-8a, Mark 9:30-37

September 26, 2021 TIME AFTER PENTECOST — LECTIONARY 26 INTRODUCTION

Someone who isn't part of Jesus' own circle is casting out demons in Jesus' name, and the disciples want him stopped. They appeal to Jesus, as Joshua did to Moses about the elders who prophesied without official authorization. Like Moses, Jesus refuses to see this as a threat. Jesus welcomes good being done in his name, even when it is not under his control. The circle we form around Jesus' word must be able to value good being done in ways we wouldn't do it, by people we can't keep tabs on.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

Generous God, your Son gave his life that we might come to peace with you. Give us a share of your Spirit, and in all we do empower us to bear the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

READINGS AND PSALM

Numbers 11:4-6, 10-16, 24-29, Psalm 19:7-14 The commandment of the LORD gives light to the eyes. (Ps. 19:8), James 5:13-20, Mark 9:38-50
