

I always think of this story when people talk about challenging times in their family of origin. I remind them that family is not always about who we are born to, but about life-giving relationships.

One of the changes in our society is that many people don't

live close to their biological families because of work locations. When we broaden our understanding of what makes a family, it is about who shows up when we need them. Who speaks with us, guiding without self-serving intention? These are your family. They may be related to you by blood or marriage, but they can also be the community of care and support we surround ourselves with.

As you plan for Mother's Day, I hope you can rejoice in the family you create and the family to which you were born.
