FROM PASTOR THOMPSON

News from Around the Church

May 17th was the Northeastern Ohio Synod Assembly. This was a half-day, online assembly. The meeting was kept to immediate business. We elected new synod council members and constitutionally required committees. The 2027-2028 synod budget was reviewed and accepted.

The more exciting news is the **One Church Experiment**. It is a plan for congregations like Zion and First to increase shared ministries. It takes the parish model one step further with the training of lay leaders, as well as calling rostered leaders and sharing financial responsibilities—the full description is at www.neoselca.org/one-church-experiment. This dovetails into the Parish Council's communications to neighboring congregations to work toward more shared missions and possible parish partners. Bishop Barbins (bishop of our synod) announced that Presiding Bishop Eaton is not running for a third term as the Presiding Bishop. At the churchwide assembly, July 28-

August 2, in Phoenix, Arizona, the Assembly Voting Members will elect a new Presiding Bishop. The term of our current ELCA Secretary also expires. So that office will be open for the current secretary to be re-elected or a new secretary elected. The Churchwide Assembly will also review current social statements that are in the works, approve the ELCA churchwide budget, and other reports and materials. The bulletin of report will be available at ELCA.org/about/leadership/churchwide-assembly by early July. You will also be able to watch the assembly livestream on youtube.com/@elca.

Keep us steadfast in this faith, defend us in all adversity, and bring us at last into your presence, where you live in endless joy and love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**


MID-WEEK EUCHARIST
