FROM PASTOR MUSE

Or who has given a gift, to receive a gift in return? Romans 11:35

When we change the calendar to December, we officially enter into the "Season of Giving," as many advertisers would claim. The apparent reason is that people will go out and buy things to give, thus driving up profits. The entire month will be filled with print and media ads showing us what we can purchase and give as gifts. But the underlying theme is that others will buy and give you gifts. This completes the gift-giving cycle; everyone can reflect on a sound economic year. I am all for a good financial year because we all benefit from that. Still, the notion of gift-giving, especially this time of year, is far more profound and resides in our own narrative.

The season of Advent tells us the narrative leading up to the first and most precious gift, that of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, born into time. The incarnation of the gift-giving this time of year is to reflect and mirror the very



heart of God in the gift-giving pattern. God gave us what we could never acquire by any means and that we could never repay, no matter how much we give in return. This is the true nature of a gift, that it is outside the ability to repay. The coming of the Christ child is more than we can ever amass or accumulate, so we dwell with this incredibly gracious God. Now, God never wanted us to repay the gift to God since we could not. Still, God wanted us to show the power of the gift by expressing our own generosity, individually and as a part of something bigger.

Throughout the year, stemming from this generous event, we are to look at the blessings we receive, which are many, and then respond in our own way to glorify God through our generosity. This can be done in various ways, including but not limited to purchasing gifts, giving our time, sharing our unique talents, imparting wisdom, and bringing a calm presence in the chaos; the list could continue. God desires us to be generous with the gift of life we have been given individually.

We are also part of something bigger than ourselves, and that bigger can do more with a unified presence. God has called us together as a faith community, and we gather around the gift of God in Jesus Christ, born, crucified, and risen. Together, we can use the combined generosity for the good of the kingdom, and how we show generosity in the community

DECEMBER 2023—The Word of God in Worship

<u>December 3 First Sunday of Advent</u> <u>Introduction</u>

Stir up your power, and come! The psalmist's plea in Psalm 80:2 has become familiar to us in the Advent prayers. Isaiah wants God to rip the heavens open. Both cry out for an apparently distant, angry God to show up, to save, to restore. When we hear Jesus describing the coming of the Son of Man with stars falling from heaven, it can sound dire and horrible, not like anything we would ever hope for. But when we really look at the suffering of people God loves, we can share the hope that God would tear open the heavens and come.

Prayer of the Day

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. By your merciful protection awaken us to the threatening dangers of our sins, and keep us blameless until the coming of your new day, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Readings and Psalm

Isaiah 64:1-9, Prayer that God would come with power and compassion, Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19, Let your face shine upon us, and we shall be saved. (Ps. 80:7), 1 Corinthians 1:3-9 Gifts of grace sustain those who wait for the end, Mark 13:24-37 The sudden coming of the Son of Man.

Sunday, December 10

Introduction

John calls people to repent, to clear the decks, to completely reorder their lives so that nothing gets in the way of the Lord's coming. The reading from Isaiah gives the context for this radical call: the assurance of forgiveness that encourages us to repent; the promise that the coming one will be gentle with the little ones. Isaiah calls us all to be heralds with John, to lift up our voices fearlessly and say, "See, your God is coming!" We say it to one another in worship, in order to say it with our lives in a world in need of justice and peace.

Prayer of the Day

Stir up our hearts, Lord God, to prepare the way of your only Son. By his coming strengthen us to serve you with purified lives; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Readings and Psalm

Isaiah 40:1-11 Good news of God's coming to a people in exile, **Psalm 85:1-2, 8-13** Righteousness shall prepare a pathway for God. (Ps. 85:13), **2 Peter 3:8-15a** Waiting for and hastening the day of God, **Mark 1:1-8** John appears from the wilderness.

Sunday, December 17

Introduction

"Rejoice always," begins the reading from 1 Thessalonians. Isaiah and the psalmist make clear that God is turning our mourning into laughter and shouts of joy. "All God's children got a robe," go the words of a spiritual. It is not so much a stately, formal, pressed outfit as it is a set of party clothes, clothes we are happy to wear. We receive that robe in baptism, and in worship we gather for a foretaste of God's party.

Prayer of the Day

Stir up the wills of your faithful people, Lord God, and open our ears to the words of your prophets, that, anointed by your Spirit, we may testify to your light; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Readings and Psalms

Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11 Righteousness and praise flourish like a garden, Psalm 126, The Lord has done great things for us. (Ps. 126:3), Luke 1:46b-55 (alternate) You, Lord, have lifted up the lowly. (Lk. 1:52), 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24 Kept in faith until the coming of Christ, John 1:6-8, 19-28 A witness to the light.

Sunday, December 24 Introduction

In winter's deepest night, we welcome the light of the Christ child. Isaiah declares that the light of the long-promised king will illumine the world and bring endless peace and justice. Paul reminds us that the grace of God through Jesus Christ brings salvation to all people. The angels declare that Jesus' birth is good and joyful news for everyone, including lowly shepherds. Filled with the light that shines in our lives, we go forth to share the light of Christ with the whole world.

Prayer of the Day

Almighty God, you made this holy night shine with the brightness of the true Light. Grant that here on earth we may walk in the light of Jesus' presence and in the last day wake to the brightness of his glory; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

Readings and Psalm

<u>Isaiah 9:2-7</u> Light shines: a child is born for us, <u>Psalm 96</u> Let the heavens rejoice and the earth be glad. (Ps. 96:11), Titus 2:11-14, The grace of God has appeared, <u>Luke 2:1-14 [15-20]</u> God with us.

Sunday, December 31 Introduction

The psalmist calls on the natural world, celestial bodies, fire and earth, creatures, and all humanity, to praise God. The voices of Simeon and 84-year-old Anna join the chorus today, recognizing what God is doing in Jesus. Simeon's song is often sung after communion, for we have seen God's salvation in the assembled community and have held Jesus in our hands in the bread. Then, like the prophet Anna, we tell of Jesus to all who look for the healing of the world.

Prayer of the Day

Almighty God, you wonderfully created the dignity of human nature and yet more wonderfully restored it. In your mercy, let us share the divine life of the one who came to share our humanity, Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
