THE JOY AND SACRIFICE OF SERVING

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. (John 15:12-13 NRSV)

This text is from our Gospel on May 5, 2024. It is a reminder that serving God is also serving God's world. It is a joy and a sacrifice. Like everything in life, we must say "no" to another when choosing one option. We are called to bless others, which also means we voluntarily give our time, finances, and energy.

This text strikes me during this lectionary cycle because I have volunteered to spend a week with about 15,000 youth and their adult chaperones. This is the National Youth Gathering (NYG), a life-changing event that brings together thousands of young people nationwide. The pre-gathering events in New Orleans, Louisiana, July 14-20, will be filled with young people learning more about faith and serving the people in and around New Orleans. My specific role(s) has not been told to me. I could be working an information booth, greeting participants at mass gatherings, or taking them to their service projects.

I chose this volunteer opportunity for two reasons. First, the Canton City Lutheran Parish has no active youth in the NYG age bracket. Second, I have the time and ability to help make this event as powerful for this year's participants as I have seen it change and challenge the young people I took as a chaperone. I attended this event when I was in high school and it was a transformative experience. I know the power it has for young people to see there are thousands of other Lutheran Youth, and together, we can make a difference in each other's lives and the city we are visiting.

What do I know from attending? I will be busy all day, every day of the week. The gift I can give of my time and the costs of travel are small compared to the return on the lives of the attendees. I will also grow and be challenged in my faith.

How can you contribute? It doesn't have to be a week with thousands of teens. Will you make time for the ministries of the congregation? Would you consider taking on a leadership role for a congregation? If you're unsure, we're here to help you find the right fit.

If you don't know where you can help, talk to Pastor Tim or me. Then, reach out to our committee leaders: Greg Brookes and Karen Wolfe—Outreach; Pastor Diana— Ministry Support; Gina Falconer—Worship; Jill Mehl— Vacation Bible School; Norita Webb—Fellowship.

The more each of us serves, the less burden on every one of us, and most importantly, more work is done to share God's love and bless God's world.

JUNE 2024—The Word of God in Worship

<u>Sunday, June 2, 2024</u> Introduction

Deuteronomy makes clear that sabbath-keeping is meant for the welfare of all. God delivered the Israelites out of slavery, so they should observe this freedom with a day of rest. No one should work seven days a week; even slaves and foreigners should be able to rest. Yet human beings can turn even the most liberating religious practice into a life-destroying rule. Jesus does not reject sabbath-keeping, but defends its original life-enhancing meaning. Our worship and our religious way of life are to lead to restoration: the hungry being fed and the sick being healed.

Prayer of the Day

Almighty and ever-living God, throughout time you free the oppressed, heal the sick, and make whole all that you have made. Look with compassion on the world wounded by sin, and by your power restore us to wholeness of life, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

Sunday, June 9, 2024

Introduction

A house divided against itself cannot stand. Jesus makes this observation in light of charges that he is possessed. He is possessed, not by a demon, but by the Holy Spirit. We who have received the Holy Spirit through baptism have been joined to Christ's death and resurrection and knit together in the body of Christ. Those with whom we sing and pray this day are Jesus' family. With them we go forth in peace to do the will of God.

Prayer of the Day

All-powerful God, in Jesus Christ you turned death into life and defeat into victory. Increase our faith and trust in him, that we may triumph over all evil in the strength of the same Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.**Amen.**

<u>Sunday, June 16, 2024</u> Introduction

The mustard seed becomes a great shrub that shelters the birds, recalling ancient images of the tree of life. We'd expect a cedar or a sequoia, but Jesus finds the power of God better imaged in a tiny, no-account seed. It's not the way we expect divine activity to look. Yet the tree of life is here, in the cross around which we gather, the tree into which we are grafted through baptism, the true vine that nourishes us with its fruit in the cup we share. It may not appear all that impressive, but while nobody's looking it grows with a power beyond our understanding.

Prayer of the Day

O God, you are the tree of life, offering shelter to all the world.

Graft us into yourself and nurture our growth, that we may bear your truth and love to those in need, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen. Readings and Psalm** <u>Ezekiel 17:22-24</u> *The sign of the cedar, planted on the mountain of Israel*

<u>Sunday, June 23, 2024</u>

Introduction

Now is the acceptable time; now is the day of salvation! Now we are in the storm, the boat almost swamped; but Jesus is here now, and when we call him, he will calm the storm. Even the wind and waves listen to him as they would to their creator. We also listen to him and are called to believe in the power of God's word in him, a power greater than all that we fear.

Prayer of the Day

O God of creation, eternal majesty, you preside over land and sea, sunshine and storm. By your strength pilot us, by your power preserve us, by your wisdom instruct us, and by your hand protect us, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

Sunday, June 30, 2024

Introduction

A woman finds healing by touching Jesus' cloak, and a girl is restored to life when he takes her by the hand. In both cases a boundary is crossed: in Jesus' time the hemorrhaging woman was considered ritually unclean, polluting others by her touch, and anyone who touched a corpse also became unclean. In Mark's gospel Jesus breaks down barriers, from his first meal at a tax collector's house to his last breath on the cross as the temple curtain is torn in two. We dare to touch Jesus in our "uncleanness" and to live as a community that defines no one as an outsider.

Prayer of the Day

Almighty and merciful God, we implore you to hear the prayers of your people. Be our strong defense against all harm and danger, that we may live and grow in faith and hope, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.
