FROM PASTOR MUSE

Every Sunday, during worship, our liturgy contains 17 to 22 different and distinct items. This is part of our worship identity, knowing that not every person will be moved by every part of worship. Each item is offered for a unique purpose. Some items are essential in the "Shape of the Rite" (liturgy), and others can be added or subtracted in accord with the identity of the community. However, each item, either essential or not, is created for an intended purpose. This includes the Greeting of Peace.

Many churches opt-out of the Greeting of Peace altogether, as a time-saver, or use it as an interlude during worship. Neither one of those choices are theologically sound, for the Greeting of Peace has a specific purpose in the "Shape of the Rite." It is essential to have a deeper understanding of this portion of the worship service.

To gain a deeper understanding of the importance of the Greeting of Peace, we must understand the deeper meaning of the Eucharist itself. Eucharist, the Meal of Thanksgiving, is the place where God comes down and touches each sinful being, filling them with the holy body and blood of Christ. This comes after our sins have been forgiven, the Word has been spoken, the sermon preached,

the hymns sung, the statement of faith given, and the prayers offered.


The entire worship service leads up to the beautiful and powerful moment with Jesus. A moment that should be approached with a joy-filled heart and love towards our brothers and sisters. We should not be coming to the altar with enmity in our hearts towards other members of the fellowship. This is especially true if we are in direct conflict with them, hence the Greeting of Peace.

The Greeting of Peace is the time in the worship service when we, as a community, take the chance to allow for the restoration of relationships. This time enables us to seek out those in the fellowship that you may have enmity or conflict with and offer peace. This is not an "it does not matter anymore" statement, but rather a "we are at peace

in here” statement. We should be seeking to be at peace with each other in the presence of the God who forgave more than we could ever imagine. Looking beyond issues, words, actions, to see in each other the divine spark, as God looks past our actions, words, and sins to see the beloved child in us.

This is more than just a good thing to do, it is vital for our salvation. Jesus tells us, “...if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you...first be reconciled to your

brother or sister...” (Matthew 5:23-24) Martin Luther goes further, to say, “if you come to the table with anger in your heart for another member, you are eating to your own damnation.” We certainly don’t want to eat to our own damnation, so we seek out those places to make peace, and the church offers that opportunity.

Yes, this time can be chaotic and take a few extra minutes. Yet if one person seeks out another and offers peace, so as to not eat to their own damnation,

then the community, as a whole, should celebrate that opportunity. The next time you have the chance to offer peace to another, remember it is more than just a chance to say hi. It is a holy moment, that may change someone’s life, just like the Eucharist itself.

FROM PASTOR THOMPSON

WHERE DO YOU GIVE YOUR TIME?

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.
(Luke 12:34)

Jesus says something important in this short sentence. It is a reminder that our priorities are the things that get our energy and attention. What are your priorities? I ask you to think about this deeply. Not what do you want to do, but to what you actually spend your time, energy, and resources doing?

In a *World Economic Forum* article, there is a list of the average number of hours worked in each country. (1) The statistics include full, part, and seasonally employed persons, divided by the number of persons in the workforce. It is interesting to read that the United States does not top the list. We are number 11 on the list (2018 data).

Is being near the top of the list a good or bad sign? If we ask the questions, “Where is our heart?” “What are our priorities?” Having extended work hours can be a clue. If we spend (on average) 34.35 hours a week working, what are we doing with our remaining time? I acknowledge that 35 hours is barely full-time employment in our country.

Take some time to look at yours, your children’s, and

grandchildren’s schedules? How are we prioritizing, treasuring our time? Are we fill in it with lots of things? Are we making time for God and faith formation? Are we giving our time to improving our community or the world?

Jesus continues later in Luke saying, “From everyone to whom much has been given, much will be required; and from the one to whom much has been entrusted, even more will be demanded.” (Luke 12:48) Jesus places into our care the use of our time. God gives us free-will to use it as we desire. But we are also held accountable for that time by God. When we seek to align our will to God’s will, our time becomes more fruitful and life-giving for us and others.

Treat your time with respect. Align the use of your time with the priorities of God. You will be amazed at how God will give you the time you need and provide in even great ways.

SEPTEMBER 2019—The Word of God in Worship

September 1, 2019 - TIME AFTER PENTECOST— LECTIONARY 22

INTRODUCTION *Invited and inviting—that is the nature of the church. By God's grace in holy baptism we have a place at the banquet table of the Lord. When, by the power of that same Spirit, humility and mutual love continue among us, the church can be more inviting still.*

PRAYER OF THE DAY O God, you resist those who are proud and give grace to those who are humble. Give us the humility of your Son, that we may embody the generosity of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

READINGS AND PSALM Proverbs 25:6-7, Sirach 10:12-18 (Alternate), Psalm 112, *The righteous are merciful and full of compassion.* (Ps. 112:4), Hebrews 13:1-8, 15-16, Luke 14:1, 7-14

September 8, 2019 - TIME AFTER PENTECOST— LECTIONARY 23

INTRODUCTION *Called to contemplate the cost of discipleship today, we might be helped by translating Paul's request to Philemon into our prayer of the day: Refresh my heart in Christ. Strengthened by the company and forgiveness of the Christ in the blessed sacrament and recalling God's grace in remembrance of baptism, we can be strengthened in this hour to "choose life"—to choose life in God as our own.*

PRAYER OF THE DAY Direct us, O Lord God, in all our doings with your continual help, that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in you, we may glorify your holy name; and finally, by your mercy, bring us to everlasting life, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

READINGS AND PSALM Deuteronomy 30:15-20, Psalm 1, *They are like trees planted by streams of water.* (Ps. 1:3) Philemon 1-21, Luke 14:25-33

September 15, 2019 - TIME AFTER PENTECOST— LECTIONARY 24

INTRODUCTION *The grumbling of the Pharisees and the scribes in today's gospel is actually our holy hope: This Jesus welcomes sinners and eats with them. That our God wills to seek and to save the lost is not only a holy hope, it is our only hope. As Paul's first letter to Timothy reminds us, "The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners." Thanks be to God.*

PRAYER OF THE DAY O God, overflowing with mercy and compassion, you lead back to yourself all those who go astray. Preserve your people in your loving care, that we may reject whatever is contrary to you and may follow all things that sustain our life in your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

READINGS AND PSALM Exodus 32:7-14, Psalm 51:1-10, *Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love.* (Ps. 51:1) 1 Timothy 1:12-17, Luke 15:1-10

September 22, 2019 - TIME AFTER PENTECOST— LECTIONARY 25

INTRODUCTION *As we are invited today to consider what it means to be managers (rather than owners) of all that we have, it is crucial to recall that we are bought with a price. "Christ Jesus, himself human, . . . gave himself a ransom for all." Apart from the generosity of God we have nothing—we are nothing. By God's gracious favor we have everything we need.*

PRAYER OF THE DAY God among us, we gather in the name of your Son to learn love for one another. Keep our feet from evil paths. Turn our minds to your wisdom and our hearts to the grace revealed in your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

READINGS AND PSALM Amos 8:4-7, Psalm 113, *The LORD lifts up the poor from the ashes.* (Ps. 113:7), 1 Timothy 2:1-7, Luke 16:1-13

September 29, 2019 - MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS

INTRODUCTION *The archangel Michael is pictured as a prince and a general of the heavenly army, defeating the dragon (the ancient serpent, the devil, Satan). It is important, though, to see in Revelation 12:11 that God's victory ultimately comes by Jesus' death and the testimony of his followers. The power of God's truth gives us confidence in the face of evil on earth, even in the face of our own death.*

PRAYER OF THE DAY Everlasting God, you have wonderfully established the ministries of angels and mortals. Mercifully grant that as Michael and the angels contend against the cosmic forces of evil, so by your direction they may help and defend us here on earth, through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God whom we worship and praise with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven, now and forever.
